The Christmas season is almost over. Today, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Epiphany. The word Greek word, *epiphanos*, means manifestation. The feast originated in the Christian East and is celebrated on January 6th.

In the United States, since the feast of the Epiphany is not a holy day of obligation, the feast was transferred to the first Sunday after New Year’s Day.

The official close of the Christmas season this year will be on Monday, January 9th with the Baptism of the Lord. On Tuesday, the Church begins Ordinary Time.

The weekend of January 21st and 22nd will be the monthly special second collection for the CHURCH ROOF. Please use the special “orange border Special Project Collection envelope” in your envelope sets. Thank you for your continued support.

✠ Proclamation of the Date of Easter 2017 ✠
The Announcement of the Date of Easter and the Moveable Feasts

Know, dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God’s mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the first day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the sixteenth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-eighth day of May, will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the fourth day of June, the feast of Pentecost. On the eighteenth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the third day of December, the First Sunday of Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.
