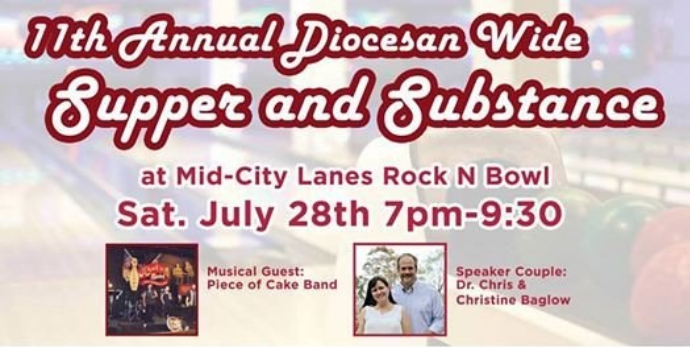

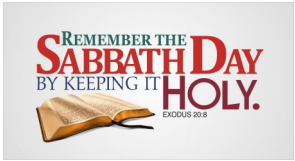

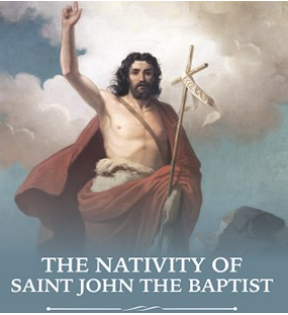
VETERANS' MASS ...
