

Dear St. Hubert and St. Peter Parishioners,

At this time when our Archdiocese of New Orleans has gone through its reorganization on different levels and has made its decisions regarding parish restructuring, both the St. Hubert and the St. Peter parishioners would benefit from looking again to our immediate neighbors to our west and to review the parish changes that the Diocese of Baton Rouge made around the year 1997, namely at Sacred Heart of Jesus in Gramercy, at St. Joseph's in Paulina, and at St. Michael the Archangel in Convent, all in St. James civil parish. Although each is still a distinct parish, they share a pastor, a central business/administrative office, and a weekday Mass chapel. Since the last three items just listed are part of what is going to happen with St. Hubert's and St. Peter's, I think it is wise for us to look at that cluster model that has been in place for over 25 years now. Are St. Hubert's in Garyville and St. Peter's in Reserve so vastly different from the three above-named parishes? Catholic church parishes are all different in various ways; however, the similarities among these five parishes are quite evident and easily seen.

If the Diocese of Baton Rouge decided to cluster these three parishes and followed through with that decision, why is it so surprising that something quite similar is happening ten miles or so downriver? The Archdiocese of New Orleans has prescribed that one Sunday Mass is to be celebrated at St. Hubert's each weekend, and that directive has not been given for any of the other parishes involved in the upcoming merges. Archbishop Aymond could have decided differently about having the one Mass at St. Hubert's, but he didn't. How many Masses on the weekend does St. Michael's in Convent, a very historic parish and church, have? One Sunday Mass – case in point – and all the weekday Masses in East St. James parish are at one location: the Our Lady of Prompt Succor Chapel in Lutcher. Some parishioners of East Bank St. James Parish still may not like it, but it's being done, and the Sacraments and Masses are readily available to those who truly want to practice and live out their Catholic faith – with the larger faith community in mind, rather than individual agendas and wants. It's right under our noses, literally next door, and it might not be a perfect arrangement, but it seems to be working for those who see the bigger picture and the reality of the present demographics of our area. Why not for us in St. John civil parish, where our demographics are close to the same as those of St. James? And let us remember: nothing is perfect in this world, and we as followers and believers in Jesus should not have to be told that. I know well that some people may be sick and tired of hearing about the "parish cluster example" upriver in St. James Parish East Bank, yet the Diocese of Baton Rouge did the same thing with the equally historic church parishes of West Bank St. James Parish as well. We are not alone in these changes, and change brings growth if community needs are placed before individual wants.

I myself have been heavily involved in the viability study of St. Gertrude Parish in Des Allemands in St. Charles Parish, in our own St. John-St. Charles Deanery, since Hurricane Ida did major damage to St. Gertrude's where I am, at this writing, still the pastor until July 1, 2024.

Our neighbor, St. John the Baptist Parish in Paradis, just four miles away, also sustained damage, but only about half as much as St. Gertrude's. The archdiocese prescribed that these two parishes merge, choose a new name for the merged parish, and start anew at the Paradis site because the St. Gertrude/Des Allemands site was too heavily damaged. So as of July 1, 2024, St. Gertrude the Great Parish in Des Allemands and St. John the Baptist Parish in Paradis will no longer exist, and the new parish of St. Michael the Archangel will begin on the Paradis campus. It has been quite emotional, stressful, discouraging, and other upsetting and unsettling feelings for St. Gertrude parishioners who must abandon their beloved church campus altogether, yet the transition has begun, and my current St. Gertrude parishioners are adapting well to the upcoming changes that they are deciding upon together in this merging/transition process. So again, I am well aware of and currently involved in the process of parish merging. Even though St. Peter's will absorb the parochial territory of St. Hubert's, again, a Sunday Mass will be celebrated in the St. Hubert church per the directive of the archbishop. The needed changes involved in the amalgamation of St. Hubert's and St. Peter's will take place after careful thought, parishioner input, and prudent planning and decision-making on my part as pastor. In short, we will transition as a united church parish family as gradually as possible so that all are informed, included, and not rushed into the changes. It's a gift that a Mass will still be celebrated each Sunday at St. Hubert's - the St. Gertrude parishioners would have liked to have been given one Sunday Mass at their site, but that's not God's plan for St. Gertrude's. So let us literally "count our blessing" for St. Hubert's.

I hope that all of us who love St. Hubert's and St. Peter's may also love God enough to change, grow, and adapt in the practice of our Catholic faith. Let's certainly not lose our faith over this. Let's let our faith, our hope, and most importantly, our love, bring this to a reality that will benefit all of us. None of us has a crystal ball, and we can't predict the future, but optimism, faith, hope, and love will surely bring about better results than pessimism, pettiness, and a lack of faith, hope, and love. We Catholics of Garyville and Reserve have a rich history of strong faith – now is the time for us to put that faith into action and trust that God is going to give us a "future full of hope" as the prophet Jeremiah proclaims to us.




