Dear Parishioners,

God's plans and timing are always perfect and correct – how could they be anything else? So when God the Father sent His Son Jesus to the earth, God planned that Jesus would have a three-year public ministry, undergo His Passion, Death, and Resurrection, and ascend back to His Father in Heaven forty days after He rose. Also, there are really no coincidences nor accidents when we believe in God and His *omniscience*, His overall knowledge and control, of us and our world, and the entire universe for that matter. So it doesn't matter whether Jesus ascended to Heaven after three, five, ten, 25, or 50 years of preaching, teaching, healing, and preparing His Apostles and disciples, there was going to be a time when He had to turn over His earthly leadership to the Apostles and preside over the developing Church from His heavenly Kingdom. God's plan was three years, and since the Church founded by Jesus, with His delegation of the Apostles – the Roman Catholic Church – is alive and well all these centuries, we see that God's plan of a three-year earthly ministry of Jesus was perfect – because it was from God. We as the apostles and disciples of today are called to be encouraged and strengthened by the fact that, with our faith in Christ as members of His Church, we can accomplish great things with the gifts which we have been given by God as His beloved sons and daughters. The original Apostles and disciples took up the challenge as soon as Jesus ascended from the earth, yet they were no different nor better equipped than we are to be witnesses of Jesus today exactly where we are. Even though we have not witnessed in our lives, nor will we ever, what the Apostles and disciples who knew, saw, talked with, and traveled with Jesus witnessed, we have the legacy of what these early Christians, the early *witnesses*, have left us. Today, we are witnesses of different things that help us to continue the work of Jesus and the Apostles. We don't see Jesus Himself or the Apostles instantaneously healing the sick, raising the dead, changing water into wine, walking on the water, or anything like that today. But we believe this because of the testimony of our brothers and sisters in faith who actually did see these things because they happened to live at the same time and in the same place as Jesus of Nazareth, the Son of Mary, and the long-awaited Messiah, who came to save us and to show us the way to the Father and to bring us with Him to everlasting life. Jesus could not stay on Earth forever—He stayed as long as God His Father planned for Him – a perfect period of time. The Church is still here today – because God's plans are perfect.

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Every day the world urges us to place our trust in countless things: money, brands, self-improvement methods — all with instant results! As Christians, however, we know that only God’s promises are worth betting everything on, and they are not fulfilled on our self-determined timelines. Today’s readings portray Jesus, the wounds of his crucifixion still visible, accompanying his followers for 40 days after his resurrection. Now the Apostles, some with questions of their own, are asked to wait once more for “the promise of the Father” of which they heard Jesus speak: baptism by the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. For the Apostles as for us, following Christ is not an easy path, the Apostles likely were wondering what to expect in this “baptism.” The fulfillment of God’s promises doesn’t always happen quickly, nor are we usually able to grasp the big picture at the moment of fulfillment. Nevertheless, it is in these periods of waiting that faith takes root and deepens. Uncertainty makes room for faith, and as the Holy Spirit descends into our life and makes things clear, we see the beauty in God’s mysterious and loving plan for us.

PRAY

Is your prayer sometimes full of questions about God’s timing and intentions, or are you able to wait in faith for God to act? Ask the Holy Spirit for the faith and hope you need to remain at peace as you wait. Then, keep your eyes fixed on Christ, and be not afraid.

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There’s a saying, “If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans.” It is often a matter of timing and expectations around life that can sew doubt into our faith. In the first reading, the Apostles ask the resurrected Christ if now he would restore the kingdom of Israel. He responds, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons.” We are reminded that our faith never obligates us to know what events are to come, and which date in our calendars to mark. Our role, as the second reading says, is to let our “hearts be enlightened, that [we] may know what is the hope that belongs to his call.” We wait in faith for the Holy Spirit to move and enlighten us to what God wills. We can rest secure in the assurance that we will be given all we need.
