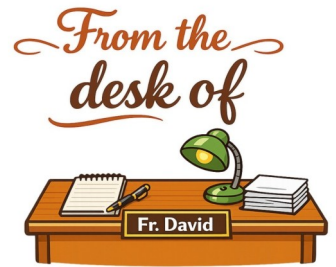


HURRICANE PRAYER.....from the Lafourche Gazette

Dear St. Peter Parish family,

By now, many of you have figured out that I must like desserts. In fact, it runs in the Frank family, as all my relatives will tell you; and after I write this, I'm going to try to bake my favorite chocolate chip cookie recipe using our gas oven. We'll see how they turn out... So I'm looking forward to gathering with you and your group of parishioner friends in your homes and enjoying some conversation and dessert (I love homemade desserts most of all)... or, if you aren't into desserts, other kinds of foods or drinks are totally fine, if you feel like mixing it up! Already quite a few of you have reached out to schedule your gatherings, so July will be a fun month for me!



Speaking of baking and cooking, I was told that there aren't many restaurants in Reserve and Garyville because most people around here can cook really well themselves, and enjoy eating their own cooking or each other's. (But if you have restaurant recommendations for me, let me know.) Now, many parishes hire someone to cook for the priests, which, believe it or not, isn't always a good thing. At the moment I'm honestly relieved that we don't have a hired cook here. It just means that I need to learn how to cook more recipes. I'm also considering having a sign-up where once a month someone can sign up to cook a meal for me, so I can have something in the fridge to eat for a few meals, or freeze the leftovers for another day. Just remember, I'm only one person, so I can't accept multiple meals at a time, or I won't be able to eat it all! And I hate being wasteful. At the time that I wrote this, the Independence Day fireworks event put on by St. John Parish on July 2nd had not yet taken place, but I have been looking forward to it so much! I'm excited that St. Peter Parish gets to be a part of this celebration each year. As we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the U.S. Declaration of Independence (which was in a way the birthday of our country) by shooting fireworks and eating all sorts of foods that are pretty unhealthy (but like most things, they're so *good*...in moderation!), let us remember that freedom is about so much more than being able to shoot fireworks and eat whatever we want. In our own country, where we value freedom so highly, it is easy to get confused about what freedom is. Freedom is *not* "being able to do whatever I want without anyone getting in my way." Freedom *is* being allowed to do what is right. In many other places in the world, people are persecuted for being Christians, far more intensely than we experience here. But wherever we are, whether in a free or oppressive society: when we are living our lives in Christ, we are truly free. So we want our civil society and liberties—which can be easily lost and which we must never take for granted—to reflect that deeper, interior freedom that can *never* be taken away by force, but can only be lost by our own straying away from living in Christ and following God's commandments. If we have that interior freedom—if the Son makes us free—then we will be free indeed!

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

In today's first reading, Israel's king comes riding "on a colt, the foal of an ass." This is a far cry from the horses and chariots the kings of other nations rode into battle as they sought to assert their authority and subdue their enemies. But Israel's king is not like other kings; he banishes horses and the warrior's bow, proclaiming peace to all the nations. Despite his meekness, "his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth." What we're given here is an image of peace achieved not by asserting military might, but through justice and humility. Of course, this image of a king riding a colt into Jerusalem will remind us of Jesus, who entered Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and destroyed his enemies (death and sin) not by political revolution but by laying down his life. If being a Christian is about claiming Christ as our king, then we must reject the temptation to seize power by asserting dominance, but instead act in ways that promote justice and peace.

SERVE

Today's readings give us a glimpse of the heart of God: meek, humble, compassionate. This week, find one concrete way you can emulate his heart by serving those in need in your community. Through these actions, you bear witness to "his Spirit that dwells in you."

GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

An essential part of the Church's mission is what we call the "preferential option for the poor." In his Apostolic Exhortation *Dilexite*, Pope Leo XIV says that "this 'preference' never indicates exclusivity or discrimination toward other groups, which would be impossible for God. It is meant to emphasize God's actions, which are moved by compassion toward the poverty and weakness of all humanity. Wanting to inaugurate a kingdom of justice, fraternity, and solidarity, God has a special place in his heart for those who are discriminated against and oppressed, and he asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favor of the weakest." (16) What this means is that we are called to put the poor, the vulnerable, the marginalized, and the suffering at the center of our concern. In our prayer, ministry, and outreach, we are called to prioritize their needs. When we live this out, we are extending the love of Jesus, whose own heart provides a place of welcome for those who are heavily burdened and in need of rest.
