#### This Week's Gospel

Luke 6: 23ab

The beatitudes were given early in the ministry of Jesus and they direct us in forming our faith while identifying the contrary nature of our faith to the world we live in. Perhaps Jesus wants us, early on, in our understanding of His call and the life He calls us to to recognize this contradiction and the price it **should** cost us.

Isn't it strange to think that we are "blessed" only when we are poor, hungry, weeping, hated, insulted, rich, contented now, crying, and having others speak ill of us? Isn't this exactly what we should want to avoid rather than think it a blessing?

When the focus of faith is happiness here, it can't accomplish its purpose. When the person living in this world desires happiness and success here, they will only find unhappiness and want. What we desire, in faith, must be only the searching for and drawing closer to God Himself. Only in this context can we find "faith" or "religion" worthwhile. This irony is a truth and is a necessity because when it is present then and only then can we be sure that we are focused on Him who we are intended to spend this life seeking.

In the "blessings" of the beatitudes you and I as believers can realize a change ...because God is present and when He is present all things change. (We need to talk about CHANGE!)
