Sale of the former St. Joseph's Property: We are happy to report that the near future sale of the property of the former St. Joseph's Church and Hall will be happening soon. After following Church Law in having the property assessed and having an interested party for purchase we are now working with lawyers to secure the legal sale. The intended use of the property is for the church to be a private home and the hall to be evaluated considering its condition.

Lenten Confessions: Beginning the 4th Sunday of Lent at both the vigil and sabbath day Masses Fr. Adrian will be available to hear confessions following Mass in preparation for Easter. Please be advised that in using the confessional room he will be wearing a mask as you are expected to do the same.

Receiving Ashes on Ash Wednesday: Due to the covid virus restrictions we will not be able to administer ashes individually on each person's forhead as skin to skin contact is forbidden. In Europe it is custom for ashes not to be put on the forehead but sprinkled onto the top of the head instead. Bishop LaValley has asked the priests of the diocese to administer ashes in this way for this pandemic time. If you do not want ashes sprinkled on your head (yes ladies, that means in your hair) then you can refrain from coming forward for the ashes. The blessing will be given to everyone once collectively but the receiving of the ashes will be up to the person. Please do not expect or request ashes to be put on your forhead as a preference for it is not an option at this time.

New Collection Envelopes: The new envelopes have been in the back of your parish church for a month and there are several boxes still remaining to be picked up. They are now removed and in the parish office should you be looking for them. You may pick them up there or you may

call the office and have them available in the sacristy to pick up following Mass. We are very grateful for those who have been so careful to be sure that financial support for the parish has been consistant. Thank you. If you know of someone who hasn't returned to church yet because of the pandemic please let them know they can call the office to arrange for the pick up of their envelopes.

Anointing of the Sick during Covid: Some have asked if Fr. Adrian is able to come to their home to annoint them prior to a surgery or due to serious illness. Because he wants to be careful to not give the virus to others he is being very careful about home visits. In fact, he has made very few home visits during the pandemic. If you are going to be in the hospital for surgery he recommends you be annointed but request the hospital priest who is there for that purpose. This eliminates him potentially bringing anything into your home or you giving something to him. If someone is home and in urgent need of absolution or annointing certainly please call him and indicate this when you do call. Tell him it is urgent! Fr. Adrian is not trying to avoid people or trying to refuse the sacraments to anyone. He is intending to be careful not negligent.
