Vote "NO!" on Proposition 1

Proposition 1, also called the "Equal Rights Amendment," will be on the
ballot for all New Yorkers during the 2024 election. It is not really about
equal rights at all. The language is deceptive. If Proposition 1 passes, un-
restricted abortion will be enshrined in the NY State constitution; children
will be able to seek medical treatment (including puberty blockers and gen-
der surgeries) without parental consent; men will be allowed in women's
sports and other spaces; and Catholic institutions could be forced to sup-
port and promote sexual morality that is contrary to Catholic doctrine. For
