Indulgences (continued from last week)

What are the basic requirements for receiving an Indulgence? The basic requirements for an indulgence are:

Visit a Pilgrimage Site (see below for local Pilgrimages sites)

At the Pilgrimage Site, pray the Apostles Creed and offer prayers for the intentions of our Holy Father.

Devoutly receive the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion within two weeks of your visit.

Additionally, it is recommended to participate in a spiritual or charitable work of mercy or an act of penance, e.g., visiting the sick, feeding the hungry, welcoming the stranger, etc., "...in a sense making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them..."

Can those who are homebound receive indulgences? Absolutely. They are encouraged to do so by praying the Lord's Prayer, reciting the Apostles' Creed, and offering other prayers for the good of the Church, local and universal. The homebound join in pilgrimage by offering up their sufferings and discomfort in union with the Church. Please keep track of the pilgrimage sites you visit throughout the year. Each Pilgrimage location will be open during daylight hours.
