“This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad!”

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ: The tomb was empty. The news is literally earth-shattering! The implications are mind-blowing! Jesus Christ has risen from the dead! He who once lived among us, suffered the agony of the cross, and died, is dead no more. Alleluia! Yes, Alleluia! The Resurrection is not just a belief that we pull out at Easter or a comforting doctrine we console ourselves with at a time of death.
