SUNDAY REFLECTION



The Hour Has Come By: Joshua Kapika

Throughout the Gospels we hear Jesus speak about his hour. From as early as the wedding feast at Cana the Lord spoke about how his hour had not yet come, but now knowing the will of the Father and wishing only to obey his command, he proclaims to Philip and Andrew that his hour has come and that he is to be glorified.

Throughout salvation history from the moment of the first fall all the way until the death of Christ, the people of God waited for the LORD's promise of salvation. As we look back at the Old Testament, we see all the things God has done to bring about our freedom, from slavery to sin and all of

it culminates at Calvary.

As we journey closer and closer to the great feast of Easter, the readings draw us closer to Christ's passion and death. Jesus today speaks to us as well sharing with us that his hour has come. The hour that he has long waited for and in some ways bore in anguish. Jesus knew all that was to happen and although it caused him great suffering and pain, he still chose to do the will of the Father.

As Catholics during Lent, place an emphasis on conforming our bodies and our souls to Christ and to do the will of the Father. We too must see Christ's passion and death as our very own passion and death. We must see his anguish and his suffering as our anguish and suffering, but what we must also remember is that. although Christ died, we have confidence in knowing that he rose from death into life and that we too will rise with Christ if we choose to die with him as well.

Effective Easter Sunday, April 4 (or as of the Easter Vigil, April 3), I am ending the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass, which has been in effect since mid-March, 2020. However, anyone who is sick, may have been exposed to anyone with COVID-19, or who has a health condition that would endanger themselves or others by being present in church, continues to be dispensed.






It celebrates God raising his son Jesus from the dead as well as the destruction of the power of sin and death forever.

HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

- Palm Sunday (Passion Sunday) March 28
- Holy Monday and Holy Tuesday, March 29/30
- Holy Wednesday (Spy Wednesday) March 31 On the Wednesday before his death, Jesus was in Bethany, in the house of Simon the Leper. ... From this moment on, Judas sought an opportunity to betray Jesus. In reference to Judas Iscariot's intent to betray Jesus, formed on Holy Wednesday, the day is sometimes called "Spy Wednesday".
- Maundy Holy Thursday, April 1 Masses 5:00pm at St. Michael Church and 7:00pm at the Mission of Sts. Peter & Paul. (Maundy is derived from the Latin word for "command," and refers to Jesus' commandment to the disciples to "Love one another as I have loved you."
- Good Friday, April 2 Station of the Cross, 2:15pm at St. Michael Church followed at 3:00pm The Veneration of the Cross and at 7:00pm The Veneration of the Cross at Mission of Sts. Peter & Paul. The crucifixion of Jesus and his death at Calvary.
- Holy Saturday (Black Saturday) April 3
 Black Saturday may refer to: Holy Saturday, the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
- <u>Easter Vigil</u>, <u>April</u> 3 7:00pm at St. Michael Church. Only after the solemn vigil during the night, held in anticipation of the resurrection, does the Easter celebration begin, with a spirit of joy that overflows into the following period of fifty days.
