SUNDAY REFLECTION


Aloha my brothers and sisters, I hope you live forever! (Response: I am on His way!)

This Sunday we enter more fully into Ordinary Time. Ordinary does not mean ordinary in the literal sense that it is unimportant or not special. And the fact that Ordinary Time refers to the period of time that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons of Lent and Easter. Advent and Christmas makes seem less important. Yet Ordinary Time is far from being unimportant or dull.

Ordinary actual comes from the Latin word, 'ordinalis,' which refers to numbers in a series. which stems from the Latin root word, 'ordo,' from which we get the word, 'order.' So, those that put the lectionary together had a purpose or an order how the lectionary was developed. In fact, another thing that seems ordinary during Ordinary Time is the color associated with Ordinary Time: green. Green vestments and altar cloths have traditionally been associated with the time after Pentecost, the period in which

the Church was founded by the risen Christ and enlivened by the Holy Spirit began to grow and to spread the Gospel to all nations.

This Sunday's readings reflect what we are to do during Ordinary Time, that is grow our faith. We are not preparing for Jesus' Birth, Resurrection. We Death or are preparing ourselves for His second coming. The seed of faith has been placed in us by the Holy Spirit when we were baptized. St. Paul knew all about this when he said, "I planted, Apollos watered, God caused but growth. Therefore, neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who causes the growth" (1 Cor 3:6-7). From now on, do not think of Ordinary Time insignificant. Instead us make a conscience effort to grow our faith. For as members of the kingdom, we are being made ready for the harvest by our inner growth in holiness and virtue, which God brings about through our cooperation with his grace.

LATIN MASS WITH FR. RICHARD MCNALLY JUNE 13, 2021—2:00PM AT ST. MICHAEL CHURCH

The Traditional Rite of the Mass, currently known as the Extraordinary Form of the Latin Rite, developed organically from the time of the Apostles with the prayers, blessings and music written by Saints, theologians and pope's of the Catholic Church's two-thousand year history.



The Traditional Mass places great emphasis on the sacrificial nature of the Mass and the true presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. Those attending will note its quiet and prayerful atmosphere which allow one to pray in an un-distracted way, thereby participating in the liturgy in an authentic manner. They will also notice that the priest faces the altar for the majority of the Divine Liturgy, turning to the congregation only for certain prayers and blessings. Its beauty has been recognized by the greatest poets, saints and scholars as "The most beautiful thing this side of heaven."


The Church Latin used during the Mass was chosen as the best and highest form of language.

Although school is out for the summer, it doesn't mean kids have to go hungry. The Hawaii State Department of Education (DOE) has announced it will be continuing its Grab-and-Go meal service to all children ages 18 and younger regardless of their enrollment status. Lunch distribution will begin on June 4, 2021 thru July 19, 2021. Pick-ups will include one lunch for that day and one breakfast for the following day.

Parents will be allowed to pick-up lunch for their children if they provide verification such as their child's Student ID, a report card, birth certificate, etc.
