SUNDAY REFLECTION



"True Nourishment"

In today's gospel we continue on with the Bread of Life Discourse. As we learned last week from Deacon Jonathan, the Church takes a break from the Gospel of Mark and dedicates 6 weeks to John Chapter 6.

In today's gospel the followers of Christ search for him when they realized he had left. Upon finding him Jesus recognizes the true reason for their desire to follow him. He helps them realize that many of them followed simply because he was able to feed them physically, but what Jesus has to offer does not only bring physical nourishment, but also spiritual nourishment.

Jesus teaches us that he is the true source of nourishment. He teaches that although the manna may have sustained their

ancestors in the desert, it did not save them from death, not just a physical but a spiritual death as well. We may think that by simply taking communion we will live forever in this world, but that is not what the Eucharist does. The Eucharist gives us the sanctifying grace that will save us from a spiritual death, a death without Christ.

As Catholics, we have been given a unique gift that truly sustains our souls for the journey from this life into the next. Many Catholics take this special gift for granted and too often they choose to skip mass. Do not miss out on the miracle that takes place every day at the Altar of Sacrifice. Do not skip out on the most intimate thing we, as members of the body of Christ, can do for our beloved savior. Remember not only did Christ die for us, he also gives himself freely to us in the form of bread and wine where he both intimately and sacramentally becomes one with us.

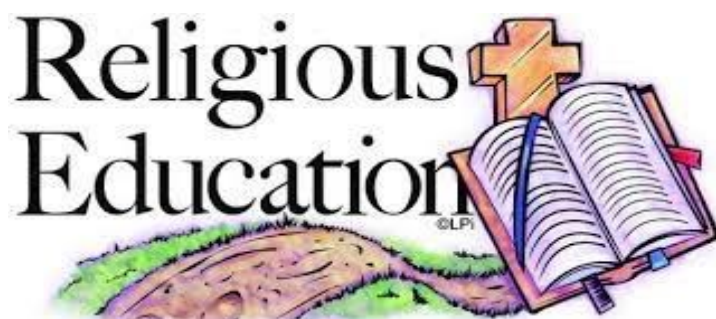

Free Meals for All Hawaii Students this Upcoming School Year

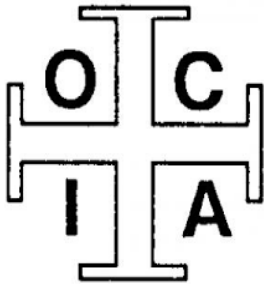
Public school students preparing to return to campus on August 3rd may be pleased to learn their breakfast and lunch meals are going to be provided at no cost for the entire 2021-2022 school year! While the Department of Education had already been providing grab and go meals for students K-12 since the beginning of the pandemic, the U.S. Department of Agriculture is now extending its waiver to continue the free breakfast and lunch meals as part of an effort to minimize the possible spread of COVID in schools. All students are eligible for the program, regardless of whether they qualify for free or reduced subsidized meals.

Parents and guardians who have not yet purchased meal credits for the upcoming school year do not need to take any action. Those who have already purchased meal credits in advance may choose to leave funds in the account for the following school year or contact their child's school to request a refund. The cost savings to households that ordinarily pay for school meals will make it possible for parents to possibly reallocate their finances to pay for other necessities. The USDA waiver will be in effect through June 2022.

It is important for parents who qualify for free or reduced meals to continue submitting their Benefits applications online using the EZMealApp mobile app or at EZMealApp.com as information derived from the application directly impacts eligibility for other school programs, such as bus transportation and Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT) food assistance.

SNAP COMPLIANCE

Families who are eligible for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) are also encouraged to renew their applications to continue receiving benefits. The Department of Human Services reports that thousands of households may be at risk of losing their SNAP benefits for failing to complete the required paperwork. In June, the DHS notified more than 17,000 SNAP recipients that their applications were due, but less than 50% have responded. Those considered to be non-compliant will be receiving notice by mail that no new funds will be added to their EBT card until they re-apply. **It is critically important that households who still need SNAP benefits maintain their eligibility by responding immediately when receiving notice from DHS. Contact your case worker if your mailing address has changed or if you are uncertain about having met all the requirements.**



SHOULD I GO TO OCIA?

(Order of Christian Initiation for Addults)

Adults who desire the Sacrament of Baptism, those who were baptized in another Christian tradition and who desire to become Catholic, and those who were baptized Catholic but never received Confirmation, are invited to participate in the **OCIA** classes, **formerly known as RCIA**.

Basically, any adult converting to the Church **must go** through **OCIA**, and this is a great blessing. That being said, no one is ever turned away because of their inability to complete a number of classes.
