SUNDAY REFLECTION



“Gather the Lost Sheep”

In this weekend's gospel reading, from Matthew, it is still early in Jesus' mission on earth, but already the crowds are getting big. Jesus knows that He will not be here forever and must start to let others learn how to do what he does. He tells his disciples that “The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.” After which He gives them authority to drive out unclean spirits, cure illness and disease. Yet, his mission for them is limited, limited to the lost sheep of the Jewish people.

We have this same mission in our church here in Waialua and the North Shore of Oahu. It is called “New Evangelization.” The universal church's goal is to unify

all Christianity; that is to end the fragmentation of Christianity which has grown to hundreds of different Christian sects throughout the world. This is a daunting goal, that seems impossible, but we who are with faith know all things are possible for God. The question is: “How do we help the universal church with its ecumenism efforts? We start first with the lost sheep of our Catholic faith. This is what New Evangelization means.

As we see week after week since the end of Covid-19 restriction, only a trickle of former parishioners returning to our Catholic Churches. Even before the pandemic the number of people who practiced the faith was diminishing. We might know

who these people are. They could be our own brothers, sisters, parents, children, cousins, friends, and even our neighbors that we know used to come to our Catholic Churches. A Pew Research survey states: that the number one reason people do not come back to church is no one asked them to come back. I encourage everyone to do as Jesus has instructed us to do, “Gather the lost sheep.” Just as Jesus needed his disciples help to do this, Father Romple and I, cannot do this on our own, we need every parishioner to help to invite the lost or lax Catholic Christians back home, reminding them also, “that the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”
