SUNDAY REFLECTION Parables of the Kingdom By: Joshua Kapika

In today's gospel Jesus provides his disciples with 3 parables: The parable of the weeds among the wheat, the mustard seed, and the yeast.

Firstly, the parable of the weeds among the wheat reminds us of the coexistence of good and evil in the world. Just as the enemy sowed weeds among the wheat, there are forces of darkness and sin that try to hinder the growth of goodness and virtue in our lives and society. However, Jesus does not call for an immediate eradication of evil, as that could lead to harm to the good as well. Instead, He teaches us patience and forbearance, knowing that God will ultimately separate the wheat from the weeds at the end of time. This calls for humility and understanding as we encounter the imperfections and weaknesses in ourselves and others. We are called to trust in God's justice and mercy while striving to live faithfully amidst the challenges of the world

Secondly, the parable of the mustard seed illustrates the incredible growth potential of the Kingdom of God. Despite its tiny size, the mustard seed grows into a large tree that provides shelter for birds of the air. Similarly, the Gospel message may seem insignificant and easily overlooked, but it has the power to transform lives and societies when embraced with faith and love. As disciples, we are called to be the bearers of this transformative message, nurturing and spreading it even in the face of opposition difficulties. The parable and reminds us that small acts of kindness, love, and compassion can have far-reaching impacts and contribute to the growth of God's Kingdom on earth.

Lastly, the parable of the yeast hidden in the dough highlights the hidden, gradual, and transformative nature of the Kingdom's growth. Just as a small amount of yeast leavens the entire batch of dough, the presence of God's Kingdom in our hearts should permeate every aspect of our lives. It challenges us to be authentic witnesses to the Gospel, not just through words but through

the consistency of our actions, choices, and attitudes. It reminds us that God's Kingdom is not a distant, abstract concept but a living reality that shapes our daily lives and interactions with others.

As I reflect on these parables, I am reminded of the importance of being patient and trusting in God's plan amidst the complexities and challenges of life. It is easy to become disheartened by the presence of evil and the slow progress we may see in our efforts to build God's Kingdom. However, the parables assure us that God's grace is at work, and even the smallest acts of faith and love can have profound consequences..

Ultimately, the Gospel today invites us to respond actively to Jesus' teachings and become active participants in the growth of God's Kingdom. Through faith, love, and perseverance, we can contribute to the realization of God's plan for humanity, trusting that, in the end, the harvest will be abundant, and the Kingdom of God will be fully manifested in all its glory.
