This coming Tuesday and Wednesday we are fortunate to have two feasts, both important, and both often forgotten: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary (sometimes called Our Lady of Sorrows).

First, some words from St John Vianney on the importance of the Holy Cross:

We need not be surprised, my dear brethren, at the honor which the Church pays to this holy wood, which obtains for us so many graces and so many benefits. We see that the Church makes the Sign of the Cross in all her ceremonies, in the administration of all the Sacraments. Why is that? My friends, this is why: It is because all our prayers and all the Sacraments draw from the Cross their power and their virtue.

During the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, which is the greatest, the most solemn and the most sublime of all those actions which can glorify God, the priest makes the Sign of the Cross over and over again. God desires that we may never lose the memory of it as the surest means of our salvation and the most formidable instrument for repelling the Devil. He has created us in the form of a cross so that every man might be the image of this cross upon which Jesus Christ died to save us. See how eager the Church is to increase their number? She urges them as a special embellishment on our churches and on all altars, and she places them in all the public places, so that we may never lose sight of the means of our salvation.



Second, a reflection on the Seven Sorrows. As a devotion, the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin have their origin in the 12th century, and were promoted by both Benedictine communities and the Servite Order, which adopted the Seven Sorrows as their principle devotion. As a feast day, the Seven Sorrows have a long and confusing history. To keep things short, in the 15th century a feast was instituted in the Easter Season, a few hundred years later a second feast was instituted in September, and a few hundred years after that the feast in Easter Season was suppressed.

So what are the Seven Sorrows? The seven sorrows are the moments of great tragedy and suffering in the life of the Virgin Mary, often represented as swords of daggers piercing her heart. In chronological order, these events are the Prophecy of Simeon, the Flight into Egypt, the Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple, Mary's meeting Jesus on the Via Dolorosa, The Crucifixion, Jesus' Descent from the Cross, and the Burial of Jesus. For each of these events, we are invited to pray an Our Father and seven Hail Mary's.
