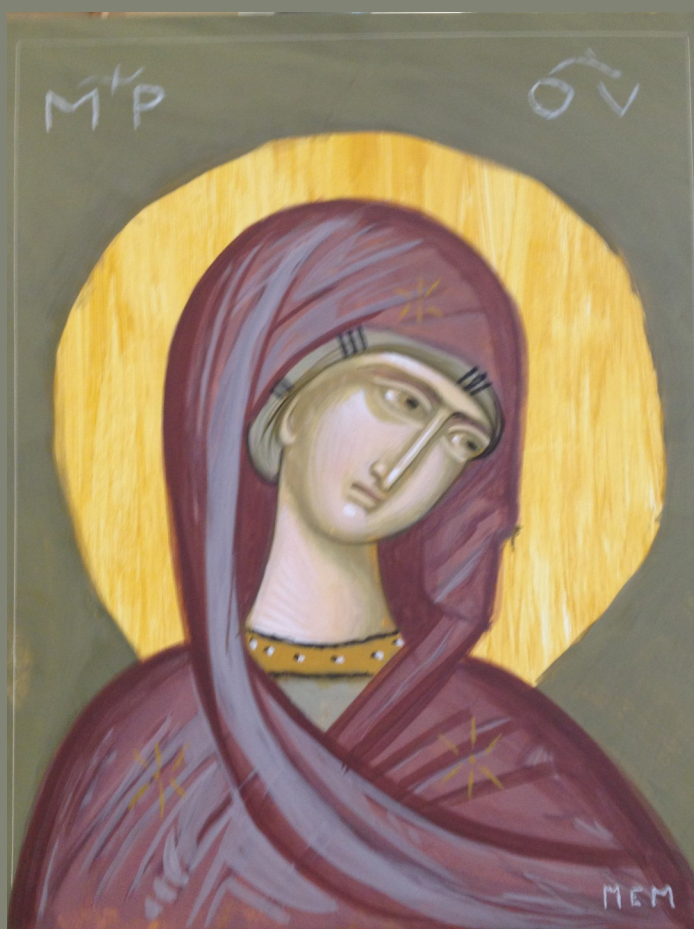

PARISH VISION STATEMENT

ST. LOUIS DE MONTFORT WILL BE A DYNAMIC WITNESS OF THE GOSPEL AND LEAD OTHERS TO EMBRACE THE LOVE OF GOD.

After so many years, even a Mom loses patience, so I ask you to share some thoughts and maybe use them as critical reflection. We need to reconsider a little about how we celebrate as God's family. Hopefully your response will lift our example to our children and encourage one another.

We need to face some realities in life. Prepare to accept that sin is in our midst as a daily option and accept that we have responsibility for growing it. We believe in a compassionate God who welcomes us as the father of the prodigal son or daughter. Yes, we are to expect a celebration, but we don't have a free card to living a life of license and indulging our ego and sensual needs. Many is the day when I am reminded that no one seems to be guilty any more, but we do have a cultural flight going on from responsibility. It sometimes seems to me that people fail to distinguish between shame and real sin. One of the Menninger brothers wrote an excellent book on guilt v. shame. Guilt is our response to real wrong we are responsible for. Shame is how someone else tries to make us feel. Good reflection material.

Teach our children responsibility for living, decision making, and caring for each other—beyond personal convenience. How far can the "church family" as paradigm enter into our lives. Apologize. Say thank you. Acknowledge the presence of God in our worship space. Where is God in our family relationship. Is covenanting with Him the beginning and closing of our day? Do our thank you's come with His loving Presence to one another?

Share the good news. Go into the whole world. To see glimpses of this living, attend a Special Olympics event. Invite another to go with you. Observe how the coaches, umpires and crowds relate to the participants. I have never left an event without wishing I could bring the climate with me. Have a meal with the Little Sisters and their "family" residents. See how they relate. There, too, you will find renewal and be more aware of the presence of our compassionate God.

Offer your personal presence during the sign of peace at Mass. Respond to the child with the same intentionality you offer the adults. Do we leave our pew space in better order than we find it? Spend less time thinking or saying "they should" or "they ought" to rather than "what do you need?" See the loving way children of varying ages hug their parent or rests their head upon a shoulder and how the parent reciprocates. See the love around us. It is present. Breath in the loving care.

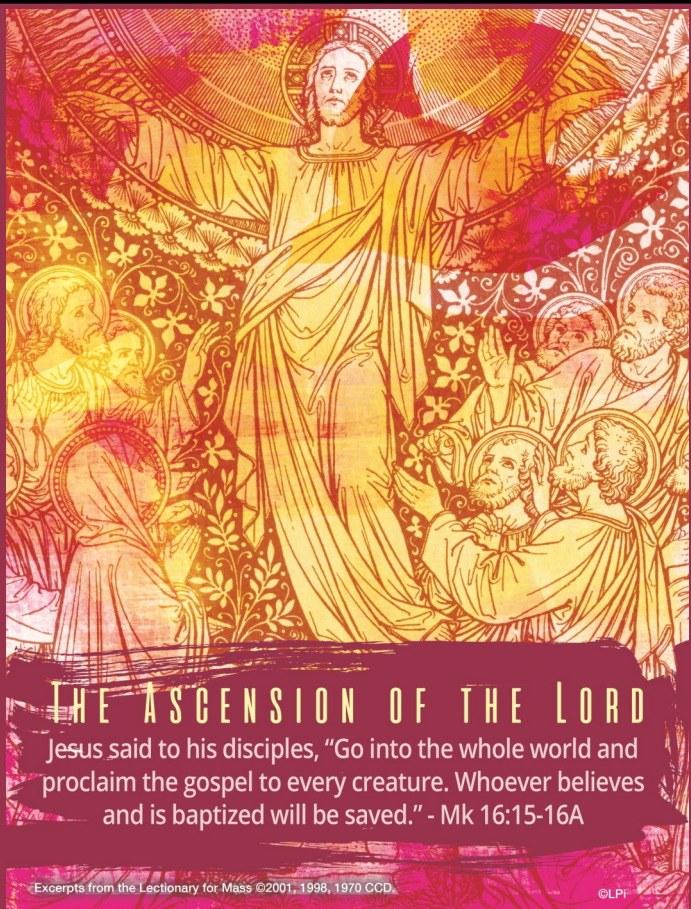
Celebrate and welcome the new babies in our church family. Offer to relieve a tired parent, or offer words of encouragement and affirmation instead of chilling stares or words. Teach our children self-management and limits and respect for others. Their happiness will increase because people respond to well-mannered children who know how to act when their parents are not with them. Mean what we say and say what we mean in a loving way. Most of what we learn, we learn from another's example. Integrity is a life-long gift. If we learn we can count on each other's truth, we begin to trust God.

In our culture, we spend time with a personal "buyer" to get just the right look for a celebration like a wedding or an anniversary yet for our Sunday celebration which is our weekly Easter, we wear revealing shorts or blouses. At Mass last Sunday, short shorts were what some of our attendees wore. I don't think a good buyer would have recommended that look for our Easter celebration. It only takes a minute to substitute a comely skirt and blouse. If these were belabored Moms, know that I said a prayer for you. Those preparing for marriage, you are invited to make the church your destination wedding location with your families and faith community. The beauty of those who have worshipped with you as you have grown is your art and environment, and their example is your pew bouquets as you process to the sanctuary to profess the covenant of your sacramental contract based in the love of your Creator. It is you celebrating in the adult Church. It is your "thank you" to God and your parents, your Eucharist—your thanksgiving. You are on your way to a deepening joy when you will bring your first child to church.

Look for opportunities to support our church leaders, such as Bishop Doherty's decision last week to publish the entirety of Pope Francis' letter to the Bishops in Chile which apologized for his leadership on the sexual abuse allegations. I hope some of us recognized that the Bishop was treating us like the adult church we are called to be by making the document entirely available to our critical, discerning spirits.

We are the adult church. Is it time to rise to the occasion and participate insofar as our time and resources allow us and to do it joyfully and with compassion? With a prayer of thanksgiving for each of you, thank you for sharing your joys and sorrows, your hopes and tragedies. Thank you for the efforts you make in God's name. It is a privilege to serve our good God and Church with you and yours.

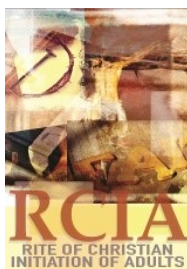
STEPHEN MINISTERS

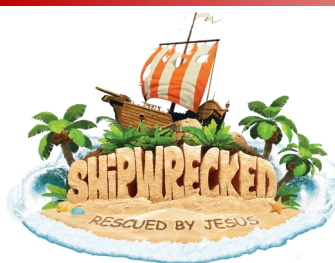

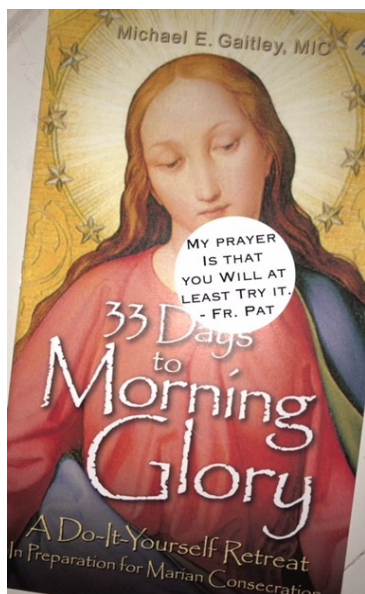

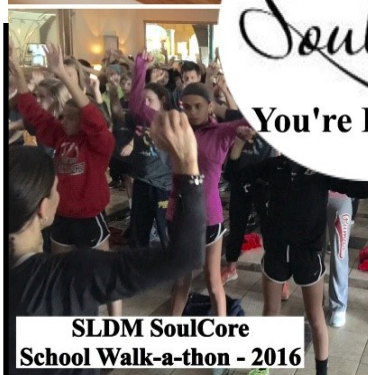
