Our readings today remind us of the great privilege we have in calling ourselves both children and disciples of the most high God.

The First Reading, from Isaiah, describes a vision of the prophet in which angels surround the Lord proclaiming, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" Our God invites us to such deep intimacy and friendship with Him that sometimes we can forget just how majestic and unspeakably holy He truly is.

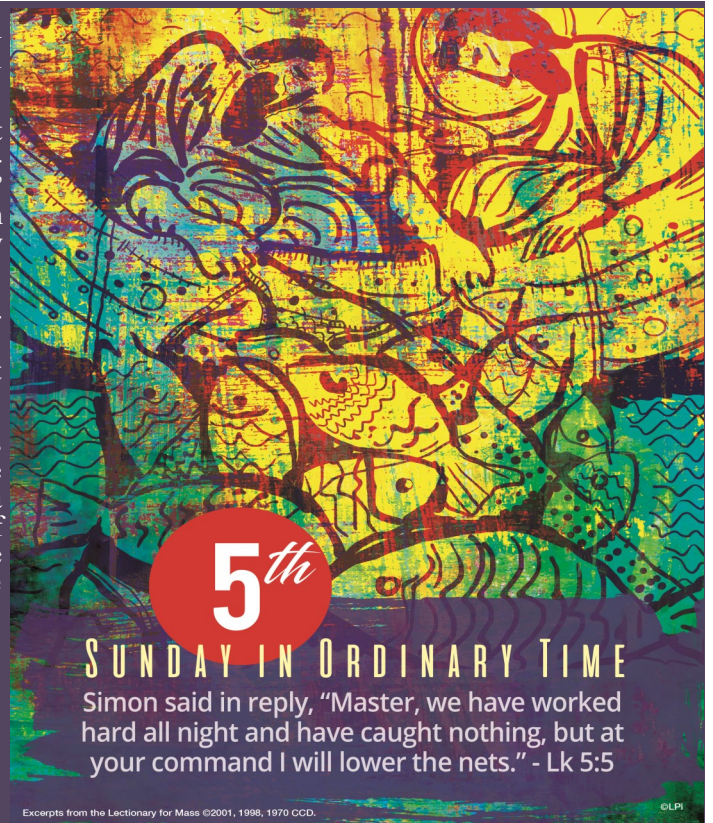
In the Gospel passage, from Luke, Jesus instructs Simon to lower his nets for a catch despite an unsuccessful night of fishing. Peter is skeptical but obeys and is amazed at the catch of fish that he makes. He kneels down before Jesus in astonishment.

This sense of awe and reverence before God should motivate us to deepen our stewardship way of life. As we contemplate the holiness of God, we come to a heightened awareness of what a privilege it is that He has chosen to include *us* in His work of spreading the Gospel to others through the grateful sharing of the gifts He has given us. Aware of this privilege, we will then make the words of Isaiah our own: "Here I am Lord, send me!"

MUSIC AND LITURGY Q & A

Q: Why do we change the Gloria and other Mass parts so often?

A: Whenever possible, we should all be encouraged to sing in response, in dialogue with the Priest during the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. There are many musical settings of the Mass (*Kyrie, Gloria, Alleluia, Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamation and Lamb of God*). We change the settings to reflect the season. Christmas and Easter seasons, Ordinary Time, we use more joyful settings. During Advent and Lent, we will sing quieter, more simple in nature, to reflect the penitential, solemn, time of year. This Lent, we will be singing a combination of Mass of Creation, and English chant, all in the Gather hymnal. Then at Easter, we will be singing a new Mass setting; Mass of Wisdom. This new setting is in the pews and will be taught before Masses soon. This is a setting that is very singable, and well used throughout our diocese. With all music, our goal is to help lift our souls through singing our prayers, petitions and praises. ...addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts giving thanks always and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father. FOOD PANTRY

For those of you who have indicated a possible interest in helping out at the food pantry, we have an opportunity for you! We need some more families/volunteers to pick up our weekly food orders from Aldi's on 96th St. and Hague Rd. and deliver it to our Sally Burton Food Pantry.

The Aldi's rotation is about once every 7 to 8 weeks, depending on how many new volunteers we get. Here is how it works:

1. Food is ordered on Monday with a copy to the pick-up person.
2. The pick-up person lets us know what day and time they can pick up that week by Wednesday morning. You can check out a key from the parish office so it can be done in the evening after hours. Pick-up is from Thursday – Saturday of assigned week. Pick-up on Thursday night or Saturday morning during open pantry hours provides help unloading the order.
3. Pick-up person goes on the day you choose – order has been paid for, Aldi's has already pulled the food and it is ready to be loaded in your vehicle. Most times the order will fit into a minivan or SUV for one trip.

Time commitment can be one or two hours. This is a great opportunity for families with kids needing service hours.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

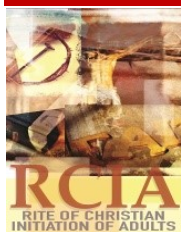

Are you looking for a new and rewarding way to serve the Lord? Do you want a ministry which the whole family (8yrs and older) can participate?

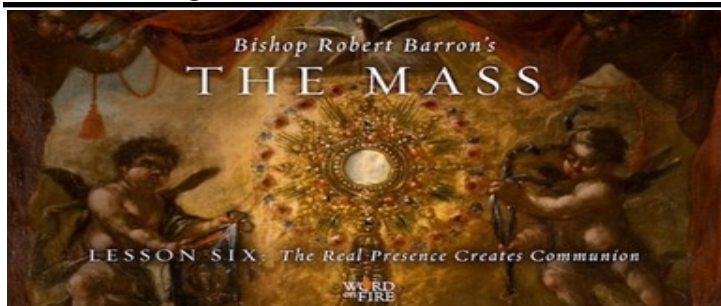

Groups will meet for 8 weeks beginning the week of March 4 and concluding the week of April 22.

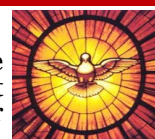

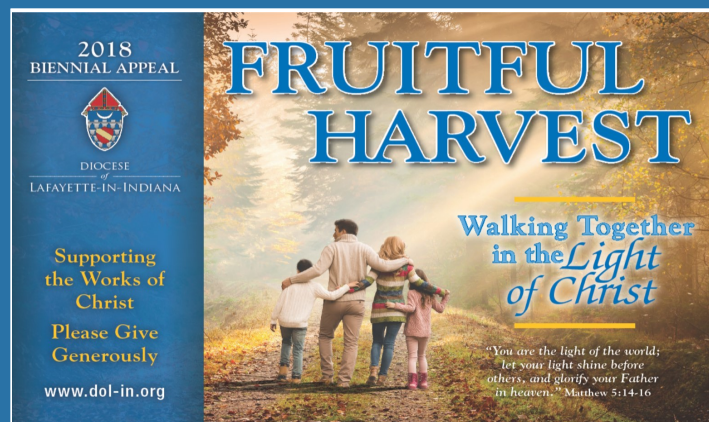

What You Should Know About the Flu Vaccine

- Generally, it's recommended to get a flu shot by the end of October for each influenza season, but it's beneficial to be vaccinated throughout the season – even into January and February!
- Anyone over age of 6 months can get the vaccine, and there are special high dose formulations for individuals over age 65 – you can ask your doctor or pharmacist about this option
- The flu shot IS recommended for women who are pregnant
- After you receive the flu vaccine, it can take your body up to 2 weeks to develop the antibodies to protect against the flu. So, it is possible to get the flu during this window of time.
- The nasal spray flu vaccine can be given to those between 2-49 years of age, who are non-pregnant and generally healthy (without weakened immune systems)
- Talk to your doctor BEFORE getting a flu shot if you have a history of Guillain-Barré Syndrome or have an allergy to eggs or other ingredients in the flu vaccine
