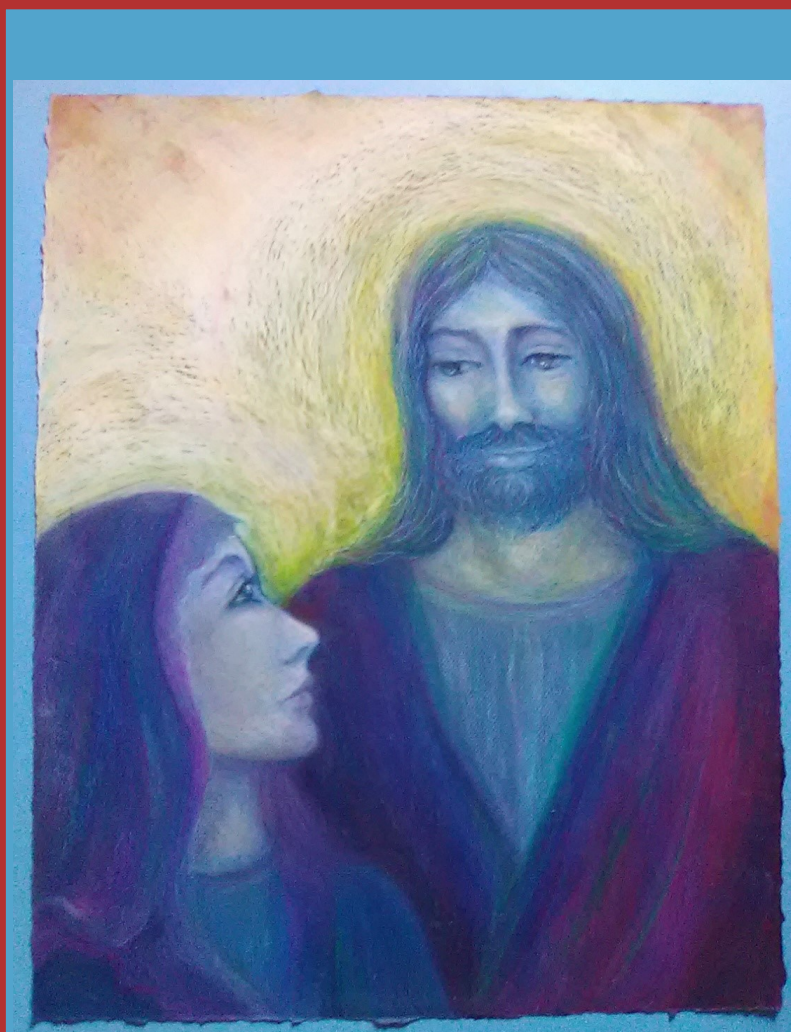

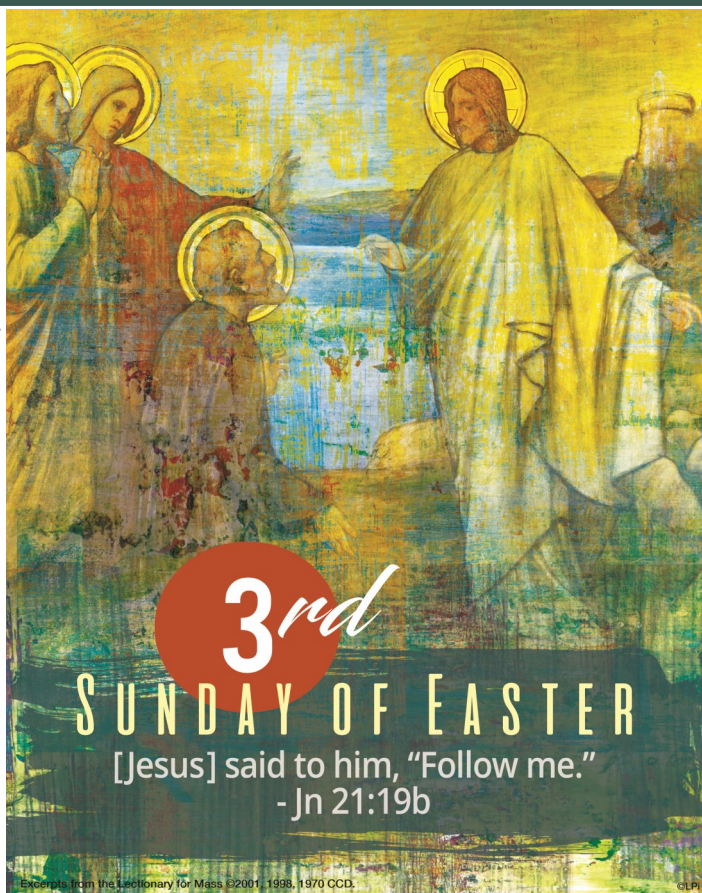

I find today's Liturgy of the Word quite thought-provoking! I am tempted to compare the Sanhedrin to our modern-day secular government. The apostles were accused of teaching in Jesus' name, and that is exactly what the Lord commanded us to do as His baptized followers. Today in the news we see more and more attacks on Christianity whether it be a law suit over a wedding cake, removal of the Ten Commandments, a crèche scene at Christmas time, or Church teaching that disagrees with secular values, etc. It seems at times that the will of secular society is to tolerate Christianity only when it is confined to our churches! The apostles said they must obey God rather than men. How do you feel about that? Once again, I recall the homily where the question was asked, "If you were arrested for being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict you"? It's a great question. Most of us do not understand the strength we have in the Holy Spirit to stand up for our faith and convictions in these times. So, if things heat up, are you willing to speak in the name of Jesus and witness to your faith in an environment of political tension? Will we be found worthy to suffer for the sake of the name of Jesus as the apostles did?

In the second reading from Revelation, I ask that you put yourself into the scene at the throne! Do you realize that the Mass itself reflects what goes on in Heaven? Just imagine the real angels that surround the altar at each Holy Mass. If we try we may see this with the eyes of our heart. What a wonderful and powerful prayer, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive riches, wisdom, and strength, honor, glory and blessing". Amen!

It's interesting that time after time in the Bible we find people doing it "their way" and failing and those doing it God's way and succeeding. We can be so hard-headed! Today's Gospel affirms this once again with the fishing story. But what struck me in this Gospel is Jesus' question to Peter, His chief of staff. He asked Him three times if he loved Him. Do you love Him? What does that love look like in your life?

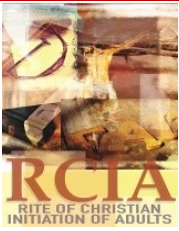

Wellness Corner

Mosquito Protection

- With warmer temperatures on the horizon, more time is spent outdoors. This leads to greater risk of mosquito bites.
 - Different mosquitoes carry different viruses and can bite at any time – not just at night. Mosquitoes that carry the Dengue and Zika viruses bite primarily during the day.
- Be sure to use insect repellent and follow the product label instructions carefully.
 - It is best to use a repellent that is registered with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Check out <https://www.epa.gov/insect-repellents/find-repellent-right-you> to find the repellent that is best for you.
 - Do not spray the repellent on skin under clothing.
 - If also using sunscreen, it's best to apply sunscreen first, then insect repellent.
 - Do not use repellent on babies younger than 2 months of age.
- Mosquito netting is an option for cribs, strollers, and baby carriers when outside or camping.
- For protection at home, use screens on windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out. Repair holes in screens as needed, and use air conditioning when available.
- Standing water is a common place for mosquitoes to lay eggs. Once a week, check your items that hold water (birdbaths, flower pots, trashcans, pools, buckets, tires, etc), and empty and scrub them, turn them over, or cover/throw them out.
