

It dawned on me a while back that a significant contributing factor to the state of affairs today in our nation is the fact that so many people have not or do not read the Bible. God wired us in such a way that we cannot honestly convince ourselves that there is no possibility that He exists. So, knowing or suspecting that He does in fact exist, our next logical step is to inquire (or at least be curious) about the reason He created everything- including us. The Bible is the revelation of God to the beloved people He created. It is, quite frankly, the operator's manual for human beings.


One of the things the Bible is clear about is that there are objective moral standards. There is moral law just like there is physical law. If you throw an apple into the air, there's a good chance it will come back down and hit you on the head! If you steal someone else's money from a bank, there's a good chance you will wind up in an unpleasant place for a while. So moral and physical laws both have consequences if they are broken. The consequences, however, as they relate to our eternal existence, deserve our full attention.

In today's first reading, we see just one of numerous passages in the Bible that warn us about the consequences of ignoring, disrespecting or disobeying the moral law (God's will). In fact, I believe that Jesus mentioned Hell more times than He mentioned Heaven in the New Testament. If Heaven and Hell are not real consequences, then why did He talk about them? Why did He say that we have ears and eyes, but we don't hear and see? He tried very hard to get our full attention. He even told us about the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31). Could He be any clearer?

We should have a very good idea of how we should live and make sound moral choices and decisions within God's Will. As Catholics, we have a two-thousand-year history of some of the most brilliant people on the planet spending their entire lives praying, reading and interpreting the Bible. A good summary of their conclusions can be found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Pope Benedict

warned us about the "dictatorship of moral relativism". It's all around us. Its time to start reading and understanding God's will for us in the Sacred Scriptures and learn the truth. Just for fun, google "Pascal's wager". It is a useful evangelization tool. Jeff Oelker, Director of Ministry and Operations





Definition of **Evangelization:**

Pope Paul VI, whose message Evangelii Nuntiandi (On Evangelization in the Modern World) December 8, 1975,

teaches that evangelizing means bringing the Good News of Jesus into every human situation and seeking to convert individuals and society by the divine power of the Gospel itself. At its essence are the proclamation of salvation in Jesus Christ and the response of a person in faith, which are both works of the Spirit of God. n.18

Evangelization must always be directly connected to the Lord Jesus Christ. "There is no true evangelization if the name, the teaching, the life, the promises, the Kingdom and the mystery

Evangelization can be viewed as a three-step process

- 1. Discovering Jesus through a personal encounter with him.
- 2. Following Jesus, becoming his disciple.
- 3. Proclaiming the Good News is to be a witness of Jesus.



Wellness Corner

Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV)

- RSV is a virus that can vary in severity it usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms, but it can also lead to serious lung infections, such as bronchiolitis (infection of small airways in lungs) and pneumonia.
- Those at higher risk for severe infections include infants under age 6 months, premature babies, adults over age 65, those with chronic lung disease, and people with weakened immune systems (from organ transplants, HIV infection, or medical treatments, such as chemo).
- There's no vaccine for RSV, so it's important to take action to prevent its spread. There is a medication that can protect babies who are at high risk for developing serious illness from RSV – it involves a series of shots. Reach out to your healthcare provider if concerned about risk for your infant or young child.
- To protect yourself from infection, wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If you don't have access to soap and water, choose an alcohol-based sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
 - Also, avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. When sneezing and coughing, cover mouth and nose with tissue or upper shirt sleeve.
 - Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that are frequently touched – including toys, doorknobs.
