A phrase commonly heard in Christian ministry is “You have to meet them where they are.” Today’s Gospel passage bears this out, as Jesus goes out of his way to meet the woman where she is: at the well, alone, in the heat of the day. Jesus knows why she is there alone. The other women of the area would have come to draw water early, when the morning air was cool. But this woman, bearing the shame of her sinfulness, could not bear to be seen. Perhaps she was in a sort of exile, considered unworthy to be among the community. Indeed, the community was broken. Knowing all of this, Jesus draws the woman into conversation and convinces her that what he has to offer her is far better than the water she, or anyone, had come to draw.



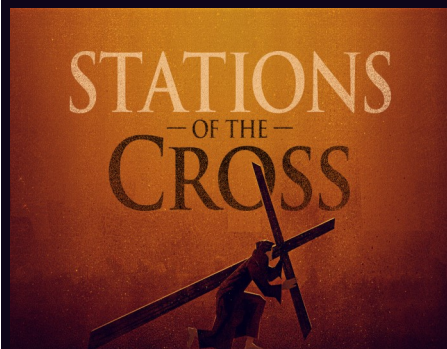
Truly, Jesus met her where she was, and he convinced her there was something better for her. But he did not leave her there. Instead, he pointed to the circumstances of her life which had broken the communion she once had with her neighbors. How she must have felt to learn that the long-awaited Messiah, whose coming she anticipated was sitting at the well speaking one on one with her!

So full of amazement, so full of joy, she forgot the exile she had been suffering and ran into town, proclaiming the good news of Christ. The sinner had become the evangelist!

In this Lenten season, we are invited to spend time in silent reflection, to let the Lord meet us where we are, and draw us into conversation. Like the woman in the Gospel passage, our souls are thirsting for communion. And, also as with the woman at the well, the conversation with the Lord may get a little uncomfortable as he, refusing to leave us where we are, shows us what must change in our lives so that our communion with him can be healed. He loves us. So much so that even knowing our sins, he suffered, died, and rose for us so that we could live in communion with him beginning even in this life, and make him present to others – to evangelize by our lives.

How indescribably awesome it is to know that, when our time here is up, that Jesus has refused even to leave us here. It is through him, as St. Paul points out, “whom we have gained access by faith to this grace in which we stand,” and – because of it – we are able to “boast in hope of the glory of God.”

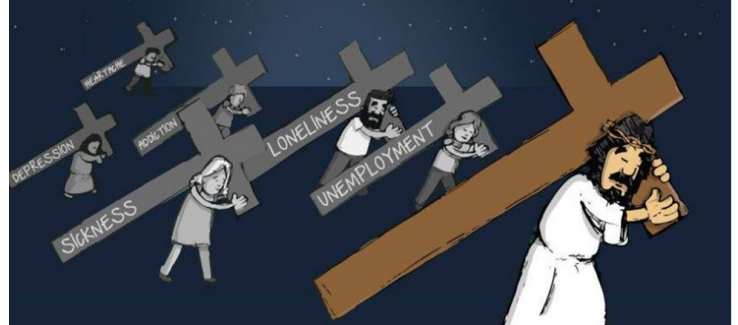

Universal Call to Holiness: Part 1

The phrase 'Universal Call to Holiness' is stressed in the Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church (Lumen Gentium); it recognizes that all the People of God are "called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity" (no. 40).

This call is directed not only to priests, deacons, and consecrated religious, but to the laity as well, and should be pursued within an individual's specific vocation (marriage, dedicated single life, parent, etc.). We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do no matter where we find ourselves. Leading a holy life is one way the faithful can evangelize the world but it's important we recognize that mistakes are normal and we may falter occasionally.

"Not everything a saint says is completely faithful to the Gospel; not everything he or she does is authentic or perfect. What we need to contemplate is the totality of their life, their entire journey of growth in holiness, the reflection of Jesus Christ that emerges when we grasp their overall meaning as a person." (Apostolic Exhortation: GAUDETE ET EXSULTATE of the Holy Father Francis on the Call to Holiness in Today's World, March 2018)

Therefore, we too, must see our whole lives as a mission. Through prayer and petition, we must listen for God to recognize the signs he gives us. "Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from you at every moment of your life and in every decision you must make, so as to discern its place in the mission you have received. Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today's world."

Only then will we come to realize "...the message of Jesus that God wants to speak to the world by your life. Let yourself be transformed. Let yourself be renewed by the Spirit, so that this can happen, lest you fail in your precious mission. The Lord will bring it to fulfillment despite your mistakes and missteps, provided that you do not abandon the path of love but remain ever open to his supernatural grace, which purifies and enlightens." (GAUDETE ET EXSULTATE of the Holy Father Francis)

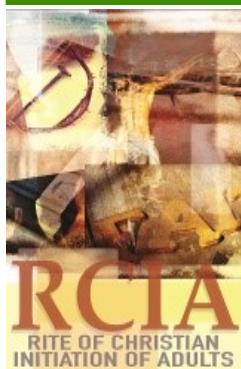

Being Prepared for Spring Weather

- The first day of spring this year is March 19; it's also known as the vernal or spring equinox. Although we know that Indiana weather doesn't always follow standard seasons, we do know that we can expect some unpredictable weather. So, it's good to be prepared for things such as thunderstorms, tornadoes, and floods.
- Keeping an emergency kit on hand for extreme weather is important. Things to include in the kit include:
 - Battery-operated flashlights and weather radios
 - 3-5 day supply of bottled water and nonperishable food
 - Blankets, sleeping bags
 - Personal hygiene items
 - Evacuation plan for the home for different emergencies, including a route out of each room and basement
 - List of important personal information – telephone numbers of neighbors/family/friends, medical information, property and insurance information, telephone numbers of utility companies
 - First aid kit with antibiotic ointment, sterile gauze pads (in different sizes), adhesive cloth tape, adhesive bandages, aspirin packets (81mg), non-latex gloves, scissors, tweezers, absorbent compress dressings
- Teach family members where emergency supplies are stored, and make sure that it is known how to turn off water, gas, and electricity in the home. (Share this information with kids too, if they are old enough to understand/complete these tasks correctly)
