INDIANA’S STATEWIDE MASK MANDATE IS NOW IN EFFECT, THEREFORE, MASKS ARE NOW REQUIRED AT ALL MASSES.

The order from Gov. Eric Holcomb requires everyone 8 and up to wear a mask or face covering in indoor public spaces. (Children between the ages of 2 and 7 are not required to wear masks, even though the state recommendations that they do so.)

AS A REMINDER, BISHOP DOHERTY HAS DISPENSED ALL CATHOLICS FROM THE OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS UNTIL AUGUST 15.

Everyone must carefully discern the best decision for themselves and their families. If you have a fever, cough, runny nose, or have been exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, please, in consideration of others, watch the livestreamed Mass from home at facebook.com/sldmfishers. We also encourage “higher risk” parishioners to stay home and participate in the livestreamed Mass.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT MASS:

There will be only one entrance for Mass - the main entrance off Hague Rd. (under the carport)
 Ushers will assist individuals and families to ensure appropriate accommodation with social distancing (6 feet of space between individuals and families—Seating will be every other pew as marked, with families allowed to sit together).
 Because we have reduced seating capacity, once the church is full, we will not be able to accommodate anyone else. Please arrive early.

Holy water fonts will be empty.

No books or materials in the pews, however, you may bring missals or prayer books from home.

Please minimize the use of restrooms. Water fountains will not be available.

We will have hand sanitizer available but ask that you please bring your own hand sanitizer if possible. Everyone should sanitize their hands upon entering the church and prior to receiving the Eucharist.

Collection envelopes and donations can be dropped off in the designated baskets as you enter or exit the church since collection baskets will not be passed around during Mass. You are also welcome to give electronically by visiting our Giving Page <https://www.osvonlinegiving.com/131>

What will happen when it is time to receive Holy Communion?

When it is time to receive Communion, you are welcome to receive the Sacred Host. Distribution of the Precious Blood is temporarily suspended.

Holy Communion will once again be distributed during Mass.

The priest will give instructions regarding the process of lining up to receive Communion.


For the health and safety of everyone, we ask all parishioners to receive Communion in the hand during this time of transition. For anyone who prefers to receive on the tongue, please wait until the end of Communion distribution to come forward to receive.

Please do not congregate inside the church after Mass is finished. We will need to have everyone leave the church promptly so maintenance can begin cleaning and sanitizing the church and restrooms.

We have returned to our normal schedule for the Sacrament of Penance. Confessions in church will follow the 8 a.m. Saturday Mass and will be offered on Wednesday evenings at 5:30 p.m. or by appointment.

“Come to me heedfully, listen, that you may have life.”
Change one letter in that message from the Lord to Isaiah, heard in today’s first reading, and the tone for this Sunday is set: “Come to me needfully, listen, that you may have life.”

Recognizing our needfulness drives all of us into a search for what will satisfy that need. In one way or another, this searching is a part of the human condition and is seen in all people, everywhere. Here in our time and place, we most commonly see the search for what will satisfy this need take on a very materialistic nature. But it doesn’t end there. The search can lead us down some very dangerous pathways, too. Every one of us has this emptiness, a need, inside that we can feel and which we work tirelessly to fill. Over time, we even begin to build an image of who we are – our “false selves” – from all of the energy we pour into what we believe will fill this emptiness.


All the while, in a million ways every day, God speaks to us and awaits our response. And in that would-be exchange, if only we were listening, is our true need fulfilled. That is communion with our Father, which can only be fully satisfied through our relationship with his Son, our Lord Jesus. Only in heeding Jesus’ voice, letting him reveal who we are to the Father in him, will we find our deepest need satisfied. We will know who we are.

Friends, today we become the disciples in the Gospel passage. Imagine that Jesus has just told us to give the thousands of people gathered there the food they needed. Imagine it. What does that moment feel like for you?

A brief look at the headlines each day reveals a suffering world full of physically and spiritually starving people. It doesn’t have to be this way. “Bring them here to me,” Jesus says. Brothers and sisters, we can do something. One by one, we can bring people to Christ. But not before we have come to Christ ourselves.

Today, let us heed the Lord’s call to listen to him. Hearing his voice, the voice of our creator, in whose image and likeness our true selves are made, we will find life, and we will be equipped to share that life in abundance.

SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE: PRAYING FOR OUR PRIESTS

A call to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest or bishop—a “holy wasting” (cf. Mt. 26:10) or lavishing of prayer for his deeper conformity to Christ.

If you are looking for a wonderful way to welcome our new priests, Fr. Thomas Haan and Fr. Sean Aaron, the Seven Sisters Apostolate is a beautiful international prayer opportunity for just that. Seven Sisters requires a minimum of seven women, each committed to praying a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament one specific day of the week, for their designated priest, for one year. The Holy Hour does not need to be at a specific time or place so you may pray in Jesus' Eucharistic Presence wherever you may be on your designated day of the week.

A sub will also be available if you are unable to make your Holy Hour for a given week. There are no meetings to attend, although the group may have optional social gatherings. The Power of a Simple Action

I remember seeing a story on a morning news program about a little girl who wanted to give an elderly man in a grocery store a hug. She had no way of knowing that this man had just lost his wife of many years and now felt so very alone and depressed. Her reaching out to the man seemed odd to her mom at first, but the girl was so insistent about giving a hug she moved the shopping carts close together so the exchange could take place. No one knew that from that moment on the little girl would ask to visit her new friend at least once a week for the next four years until he passed away. In an interview soon after the initial encounter, the man said, "I haven't been this happy in some time." Imagine the joy that relationship brought to them both over the years!

It was just a moment. It was a simple gesture. Yet, it had a large impact that no one could have predicted. You never know what will result when we give just a little of ourselves. That uncertainty too often leads us to hold back or refrain from the simple actions of love or gestures of generosity that could come so easily for us if we wanted. We should never doubt the power of a simple random act of kindness. Generosity does not need to be grand to make a big difference. The time is now, and the opportunity presents itself often to plant a small seed that God can water and nourish so that something beautiful can grow.



Phase One – Managing an Ending

We all face “changes” these days, some of them are welcomed and some are unwelcomed, some go smoothly, and some do not. Even after lots of changes, our transitions are often left unfinished. It is important therefore to

understand the difference between a “change” and a “transition.”

A “change” is anything that can shake up our understanding of the world and our old priorities. Familiar examples of “change” are: marriage, graduation, divorce, unemployment, the arrival of a new pastor, leaving the seminary, moving from pastoral assignments, locating to a new city, a new baby, ordination, a suicide in the family, children leaving home, entering a nursing home, the publication of a new missal, entering a pandemic, welcoming a new bishop, death of a parent or reaching retirement age.

A “transition,” on the other hand, is a three-phase psychological reorientation process that people go through when they are coming to terms with a “change.” In that process, there is typically an ending and a neutral zone before a new beginning.

A “change” is what happens outside us! A “transition” is what happens inside us! People in transition often go through stages similar to the stages of death and dying. They can respond with denial, anger, bargaining, depression and finally acceptance. It begins with an ending—with people letting go of their old reality and their old identity. Unless people can make a real ending, they will typically be unable to make a successful new beginning.

When dealing with change, attitude is everything. Change, without embracing the pain of going through the psychological reorientation of the neutral zone is to invite long-term anger, resentment and confusion into your life. Stay tuned for the second part of this series, where we’ll discuss the next phase in a typical transition.
