WHAT IS A EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION?

The Feast of Corpus Christi takes place 60 days after Easter. It is through this devotion that Eucharistic processions became a regular part of parish life. “The full name of this feast is Corpus et Sanguis Christi, or the Body and Blood of Christ. The feast of the Blessed Sacrament was established in 1246 by Bishop Robert de Thorte of Liege at the suggestion of St. Juliana of Mont Carvillon... It was extended to the universal Church by Pope Urban in 1264.”

A parish procession, with the Eucharist placed in the monstrance, is most commonly done on the Feast of Corpus Christi.

In celebration of 25 years of Adoration and to remind us of Jesus’ presence among us we will be having a parish procession on October 11 at 12:30. We will celebrate, process, pray, and sing with Jesus while processing through the SLDM campus, stopping at altars along the way for scripture, prayer and blessing. We adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and thank Him for the great gift of His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, in the Blessed Sacrament that is available to us every day at Mass and to adore in Adoration. We thank God in awe and with reverence for such a gift.



Today's Gospel reading, to me, is one of those with an unexpected twist. After all, here is a man who obviously had been invited to the wedding feast but is abruptly "shown the door", the bridegroom having no idea who he is. What's up with that?! If Jesus had left this detail out, though, we would lose the point of the parable altogether.

In several places, Scripture refers to Heaven, our intended eternal destination, as the great "Wedding Feast of the Lamb". It is the eternal celebration of the marriage God has willed between Himself and humanity. He has sealed this relationship with us in His Son, Jesus Christ, and we, the Bride of Christ are called – invited – now to new life in Him. The Church symbolizes this relationship, this new life in Christ, in the white garment we each receive in the baptismal rite. The white garment is an outward reminder of what must become an inward reality for the Christian person. By the way, this is the same reason our altar servers wear white at Mass.

By living out our baptismal promises, over the course of our lifetimes we clothe ourselves in Christ, preparing to one day enter the wedding feast. There can be no greater priority in this life than to live in such a way that we are known when we enter that feast in the eternal life to come.

What if the Prodigal Son never came home?
(An excerpt from an article published in *The Catholic Moment*, October 4, 2020)

In the second of a three part series on evangelization, I would like to return to the Lukan parables on repentance and forgiveness. I wish to address the parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15:11-31). In it, we learn of the younger of two brothers who asks for his inheritance, leaves home, squanders all his money in debauchery, and never returns to the father. All right, you caught me. The prodigal does in fact return home, but what

if he didn't? Well, if that were the case, the parable would look very much like the Church today. The Church is losing young men and women in droves and many are not coming back.

In the contemporary Church version of our parable, our prodigal sons and daughters often fail to recognize the emptiness of worldly pursuits and rarely consider the truth, grace, and community offered by the Church as an attractive alternative to the current trajectory of their lives. In part, this is due to the deluge of information, social media, entertainment, and education sources that confront young people with messages that contradict the Church. What is worse, however, is that they probably never knew the father in the first place, so they cannot conceive of what a return to him would even entail. Knowing Jesus is the bedrock of our faith, how then can they not know him?

From the domestic church (family) to the parish, we may be failing to introduce our sons and daughters to the Father, through Jesus. We may have taught them what the Church believes without introducing them

to the one in whom she believes. We may have given them religion without relationship!

As a true disciple of Christ it's our mission to bring the Good News of Jesus and an encounter with him to those who are in the pews, those who have fallen away and those who have not yet received the message. As we move forward to address the significant number of young people leaving the Church, your pastors and their ministry leadership teams will be placing greater emphasis on strengthening families (the domestic church), anchoring the faith of teens with improved youth ministries, and making a concerted effort to reach young adults who have left the Church. This is an "all hands on deck" effort, our goal is for everyone to participate in bringing souls back to Christ. Being responsive to the Bishop's Uniting in Heart 2030 Pastoral Plan, our offices have our sights set on your pastorates and bringing back your prodigals, too! Let's bring 'em home!

Benefits of Virtual Fitness

The COVID-19 pandemic has obviously changed countless aspects of our lives, including how fitness is included in our days. Most gyms have reopened, but they may not be accessible for everyone, and some people do not feel comfortable in that setting during this time. Outdoor exercise has been a great option for the past several months, but as we progress into colder and less favorable weather, consider virtual fitness (a class or 1:1 instruction with a personal trainer) as an option (if going to a gym isn't right for you). Some perks include....

- Flexibility – life can get busy between work and family responsibilities. With video workouts, you can exercise when the time is convenient, without spending time commuting to the gym or trying to make it to a scheduled class /training. Also, workouts can be done regardless of weather outside, or if you are traveling and not near a gym.
- Setting an example to those around you – when your kids or other family members observe you engaging in physical activity at home, it can empower them to do the same.
- Learning how to use your own body weight for resistance (or common home objects) – you can truly get stronger without heavy gym equipment
- Affordability – there are countless online fitness videos that are free of charge.
