I pray that all may be able to enjoy some leisure time this summer. I have spoken to people who are going on vacation for the first time in over a year. We all need time to be refreshed and enjoy family and friends and a change of scenery.

Recently, I took a day trip to Mercer County, Ohio. The land of cross-tipped churches and silos! A beautiful, refreshing day. Flat farmland, beautiful, manicured lawns, churches, barns and silos. Even though it was a day trip, the day provided great conversation and appreciation to history and God's creation. Over 30 Catholic sites are in Mercer County, including the Maria Stein Shrine of the Holy Relics. This former convent of the Precious Blood Sisters is now a stunning shrine of more than 900 relics of Saints!

A meal at a restaurant at Grand Lake (the largest man-made lake when it was completed) capped off a great day. This day reminded me that we are all made for leisure. The philosopher Josef Pieper describes leisure as the contemplation of the spiritual and eternal, to wonder and to hope, but never fully grasp the totality of God. Pieper says that leisure is the receptivity of the world, a spiritual and contemplative attitude of the soul, an inner silence of the soul. The psalmist encourages us in our attempt to find leisure, "Be still and know that I am God."

John Paul II reflected on the renewal that leisure offers us. "Through the recreation and renewal made possible by travel, people are restored and renewed, body and spirit. They return home to their families and work with a new perspective and enthusiasm for life."

Josef Pieper stated, "Leisure implies an attitude of total receptivity toward, and willing immersion in, reality; an openness of the soul, through which alone may come about those great and blessed insights that no amount of "mental labor" can achieve alone."

Benedict XVI in a 2007 homily in Vienna, Austria, expressed, "Leisure time is something good and necessary, especially amid the mad rush of the modern world; each of us knows this. Yet, if leisure time lacks an inner focus, an overall sense of direction, then ultimately it becomes wasted time that neither strengthens nor builds us up. Leisure time requires a focus – the encounter with him who is our origin and goal."

Whether your leisure is a day trip or a week away with family, a day or week of leisure is essential in our relationship with God and one another. Have a great summer!




Cardinal 50/50 **Drawings**


