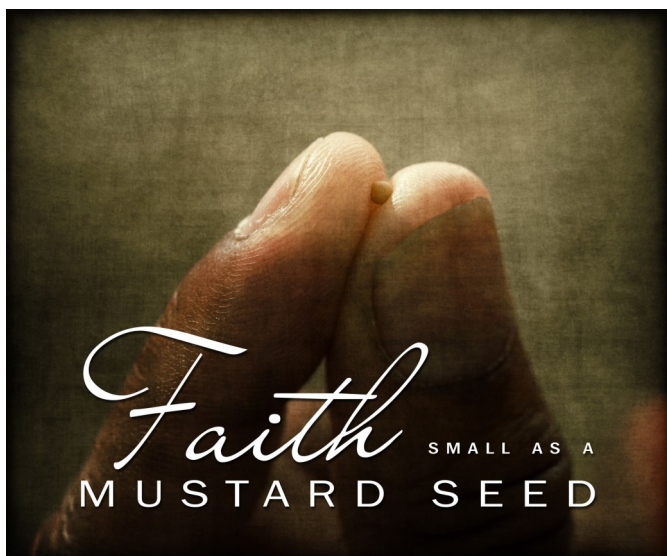

The Theological Virtue of Faith



Faith is considered a theological virtue, along with hope and charity. These virtues are infused on our souls at baptism and lead us to know and understand God. These virtues are given to us by God, and they are ours. It is our responsibility as baptized Christians to grow and mature in these virtues, specifically faith.

I like to think of faith as a gift from God. What do we do with gifts when we receive them? We unwrap the gift, open the box, take the gift out of it, and use it for its purpose. The same goes for the faith that God has given us. We need to study, learn, ask questions, be curious, and most importantly, live our faith. It is our responsibility to “unpack” our faith and live it.

Faith gives meaning to our lives. Faith allows us to know and believe in God, even though we have not seen Him. Faith gives our lives purpose, a sense of direction. Faith also gives us a strong foundation for our lives; a strong faith allows the other virtues to take root and flourish. Isaiah 7:9 supports this strong foundation, “Unless your faith is firm, you shall not be firm!”

Thomas Aquinas mentions that the goal of our human life is to attain happiness. This happiness is found in God, to be united with Him. Faith in God provides us the roadmap or the possibility to attain this happiness found in God alone. Sure, one can “get by” in this earthly life, but by “getting by” what is being accomplished? The Gospel of Matthew mentions a familiar verse concerning the faith. The Gospel says that if we have faith the size of a mustard seed, we can move mountains. The mustard seed is one of the smallest of seeds. These are the words of Jesus. He wants us to embrace the faith that is given to us. Therefore, it is our responsibility to unpack and put the gift of faith to work.

St. Thomas Aquinas “also mentions the importance of human effort in regard to faith and the search for truth.” Here, Aquinas and St. Paul relate to the responsibility and the “human effort” necessary in utilizing our faith. Parents are the primary teachers of the faith to their children. In baptism, the priest or deacon addresses the parents, saying they “are undertaking the responsibility of raising their child in the faith.” Then, the parents are asked, “Do you understand this responsibility?” In this regard, the parent’s responsibility is to pass on the faith they have received to their children. Parents should talk to their children often about their faith. This instills an early and sound foundation for the children as they mature. Here at St. Louis de Montfort, we are truly blessed with the opportunities to grow in our faith, from children’s religious education, junior high and high school religious formation, young adult and adult formation, to name a few. Last week, a visitor stopped in the parish office and was impressed with all the activities and formation opportunities we offer at St. Louis de Montfort.

Next month, October 22 is the feast day of St. John Paul II. His life and his faith are great examples for us today. He lived in a time when faith was attacked and suffered. In his book *Witness to Hope*, author George Weigel wrote, “Much of late modernity assumes that dependence on God is a mark of human immaturity and an obstacle to human freedom. The life of Karol Wojtyla and his accomplishment as Pope John Paul II suggest a dramatic and alternative possibility: that a man who has been seized and transformed by the ‘more excellent way’ can bend the curve of history so that freedom’s cause is advanced.”

Faith is a vital part of our lives here on earth. It is a gift from God. Our lives have greater meaning and purpose when we recognize, take ownership, and nurture our faith. St. John Paul II and the saints give us an example of how to live out the virtue of faith beautifully and attractively.

What is 40 DFL?

40 Days for Life is an internationally coordinated 40-day campaign that aims to end abortion locally through prayer and fasting, community outreach, and a peaceful all-day vigil in front of abortion businesses.

It is a peaceful and educational presence. Those who are called to stand witness during this 24-hour-a-day presence send a powerful message to the community about the tragic reality of abortion. It also serves as a call to repentance for those who work at the abortion center and those who patronize the facility.

PRAYER & FASTING

Each day during 40 Days for Life, individuals, churches, families, and groups will be asked to join together in prayer for a specific request so the entire Body of Christ can unite around a common focus.

People of faith are also invited to fast throughout 40 Days for Life. We believe that when God's people fast with a broken, repentant, and contrite spirit, our heavenly Father will hear from heaven and heal our lives, our churches, our communities, our nation, and our world.

In my recent article in the September 19 edition of *The Catholic Moment*, I share a story about a time my grandmother imparted some very profound advice to me as I prepared to transition into junior

high school. As we went for a walk, she invited us to pray and reminded me of the story of our faith and Jesus' own sacrifice of his life for the love of each of us. She told me that in both my family and in my school, if I wasn't open to the possibilities that situations and life presented, I would always be an obstacle to the good of God's plan.

In many ways, we are in a very similar transition as Uniting in Heart is taking shape in each of our pastorates. As people united in the heart of Jesus, our possibilities are unlimited. Saint Irenaeus wrote: "The glory of God is man fully alive." Our true fulfillment is life in Christ, not self-fulfillment. So in faith we know God wants us to be fully alive in him, living in his love, peace and joy.

Just as there is much more to this story, the possibilities of Uniting in Heart are endless! I have been truly amazed by the working of the Holy Spirit in our process. Many of our priests and lay faithful are excited about the possibilities of Uniting in Heart and many have already experienced fruits of more vibrant pastorates. Their encounters anew with the Lord Jesus and the living Gospel are beyond their imaginations. Understandably, others are still not quite sure what Uniting in Heart is or how it will impact them.

I encourage you to pick up your copy of *The Catholic Moment* to read more about this pearl of wisdom that my grandmother imparted on me so many years ago, and to read about the many opportunities Uniting in Heart is presenting to us so that each of us may be fully alive in Christ Jesus! As always, and as Bishop Doherty reminds us daily, continue to include the Holy Spirit in our discernment process, and trust in Jesus who says, *Behold, I make all things new.* (Revelation 21:5) Can you imagine the possibilities...? Let us begin by loving Jesus!

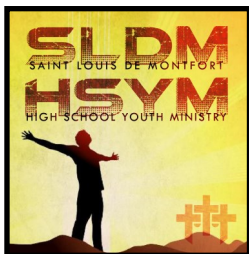

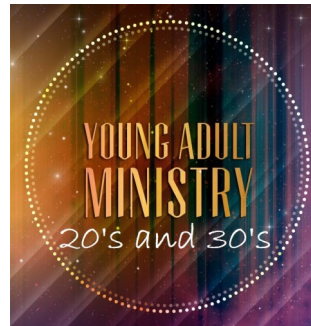
