My Most Prized Possession

More than a few parishioners have inquired about the chalice I use at Holy Mass, and whether it has a story. It's shape and style are dramatically different than (but by no means superior to) most other chalices. And some have noticed I haven't used it for a few weeks... that's because it's my most prized possession, and I gave it up for Lent!

Not every priest has his own chalice, but most do. Traditionally, (but not always), the parents of the priest give a chalice to their son as a gift. My parents assisted me in choosing chalice, one we all would find fitting for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. When I was growing up, the pastor of my home parish (Fr. Tim Alkire at St. Boniface in Lafayette) had a chalice with a taller stem and a tulip-shaped cup. I investigated for quite some time, and finally we all fell in love with one from a company near

Manhattan called Adrian Hamers. They did not have a detailed record of its history, but they estimate it is around one hundred years old. It is silver, but is gold plated inside the cup. Along the base of the chalice is pattern of heads of wheat, which are quite significant as I grew up on a farm which raised some wheat (and other grains). Underneath the chalice are inscribed the words, "Father Thomas J Haan, Ordained June 8, 2013, from your loving parents." Underneath is also attached a special "four-way" medal which my father had worn, reminding me to pray for my parents and my entire family at each and every Mass.

I'll probably use the chalice for Holy Thursday Mass, but I know it will add to my Easter joy when I see it placed on the altar.

The numbers drawn were 1173 and 3793.


The amount in the rollover jackpot is \$15,555.00.






What: The Mass with Bishop Barron




