# SAINT LOUIS DE MONTFORT CATHOLIC CHURCH AND SCHOOL HISTORY

- In 1978 the parish was established because of the steady growth in Hamilton County. The church was built in 1980 with an initial membership of 160 families.
- In 1988 Craig Willy Hall was built to provide 4000 square feet of space for social activity.
- In 1993 John Burkhard donated the bell tower in memory of his wife Berly.
- In 1994 the Youth Ministry Center was completed in the fall. It was designed to provide classrooms, an assembly area, and facilities for overnight retreats in its 10,000 square feet of space.
- In 1995 the perpetual Adoration Chapel opened.
- In 1999 the dream of a parochial school became a reality at the groundbreaking on August 15. The school began its inaugural year on August 17, 2000. This ministry of St. Louis de Montfort serves youth from pre-K through 8th grade.
- In 2003 the Silver Jubilee of the parish saw the opening of a food pantry.
- In 2008 a memorial garden for deceased children was established, along with a labyrinth for all to enhance their prayer opportunities. Both were funded by parishioners who contributed to Mardi de Montfort's fund-a-project.
- In 2009 the Faith Community of St. Louis de Montfort was recognized as a "Stewardship Parish of Distinction" by the Diocese of Lafayette.
- In 2010 our Sanctuary was expanded and renovated to enhance our worship experience. A new playground was added because of the generosity of people who've given to Mardi de Montfort's fund-a-project.
- In 2011 a new Altar was designed and built by Fr. John Kiefer and Steve Grusak. The Mardi de Montfort fund-a-project made this possible. The altar was dedicated by Bishop Timothy Doherty on April 7, 2011. In addition to the altar, Mardi Fund-a-project allowed for new liturgical furnishings including: ambo, chair, ambry, sacred glass oil vessels, processional candles, and altar candle sticks.
- In 2011 St. Louis de Montfort Catholic school received the Pillar Award, Business of the Year, by the Fishers Chamber of Commerce.
- In 2011-2012 the Indiana Department of Education named St. Louis de Montfort Catholic school an Indiana Four Star School.
- In 2012 the Ministry Center was renovated and updated through the generosity of Mardi Fund-a-project.
- In 2013 St. Louis de Montfort Catholic school received the National Blue Ribbon award from the United States Department of Education in Washington DC.
- In 2018 we celebrated the parish 40th Anniversary and a new processional cross designed by parishioner, Adam Smith was dedicated on April 28th. The bronze corpus sculpture was created by Ryan Feeney, a local artist through the generosity of Robert and Joan Smith.

Looking back at our accomplishments and struggles, we recognize our many blessings and the fruits of our labor.

#### SAFE & SACRED PROTOCOL TRAINING

Everyone who works with young people and/or vulnerable adults shares the responsibility of creating safe environments. We are all charged with treating life with the respect and dignity given to each of us by our God.

All staff, clergy and religious volunteers who work directly with children must complete the diocesan online Safe Environment Training Program every three years.

You will also be asked to complete a background screening application as part of the safe environment training process. Your training certificate will not be issued until the results of your background screening are reviewed. The program is designed to be respectful of the topic and your time. The site is accessible anytime and on most computers, mobile devices and smartphones at https://safeandsacred-dol-in.org/.
