A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS

"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can this faith save him? ...Indeed someone might say, You have faith and I have works.' Demonstrate your faith to me without works and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works."

The letter of St. James clearly reveals that we can see faith in action. We are saved by Jesus, so faith is essential. Faith cannot be observed, but our works tell the story.

The works of mercy, reflected in the judgement scene of Matthew, help us to examine how deep is our faith and how well it is expressed. Our care for the hungry, homeless, foreigner, the sick and dying is the expression of compassion and our response to Jesus Christ in them. They are us.

September is the month of devotion to the Seven Sorrows of Mary

Why is Mary the Our Lady of Sorrows? We honor Mary as Our Lady of Sorrows because the depth of her sorrow reflects the depth of her love for her Son and indeed for all of us. The Seven Sorrows are historical. Mary was with Christ throughout his suffering and because she is His mother, she also suffers. She stands nearby, amidst the crowd on the path to Calvary, upright and brave at the foot of the Cross, weeping. Let us never hesitate to run to Mary for consolation and help when we are faced with adversity and suffering, for she will be there, standing with us and suffering with us, bringing it all to the feet of her Son on our behalf.

Many Catholics find solace meditating on the Seven Sorrow of Mary 1-The piercing of Mary's heart predicted at Jesus' presentation in the Temple. **2**-The flight into Egypt. **3**-Searching for the child Jesus in Jerusalem. **4**-Meeting Christ on the road to Calvary. **5**-Standing near the cross of Christ. **6**-Receiving the body of Christ from the cross. 7-The burial of Christ.

Twenty-Fourth Sunday In Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 50:5-9a

Isaiah describes the willingness of the Suffering Servant to submit to the persecution of his enemies. This willingness stems from true faith in God, and the knowledge that the Lord will always be his help.

Second Reading: James 2:14-18

James states that if some one is hungry and you wish them well but do not help them, you have done them no good. He compares this to stating your faith, without backing it up with your actions. He reminds us that we must show our faith through our good works.

Gospel: Mark 8:27-35 lesus taught his disciples that as the Messiah, he had to suffer much, be put to death, and rise three days later. Peter began to disagree and Jesus reprimanded him for judging by human standards rather than by God's. He told them that whoever would be willing to lose their life for the sake of Jesus and the gospel, will in fact preserve their life forever.
