Sacramental Prep Policy:

In compliance with Archdiocesan policy and recommendations for the preparation and reception of the Sacraments, St. Patrick requires that any candidate receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation, Church. At St. Patrick we know that we First Reconciliation and First Eucharist must be actively involved in age appropriate Religious Education for a minimum of 1 year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacraments. The candidates must have regular attendance in our programs. Additionally, it will be expected that each candidate will continue to be involved in age appropriate assist you in registering with the Parish. classes and regularly attend weekend Mass during the period of Preparation for the Sacrament.



REFLECTING ON THE GOSPEL

A missing child is a parent's worst fear. We can imagine being in a grocery store, a department store, or even an amusement park and the panic that would overtake us if a child in our care was nowhere to be found. We might have been relying on someone else to keep an eye on this young one, only to realize that was a misunderstanding. Such things happen occasionally and often the child is found shortly thereafter. Other times it results in tragedy. But in today's gospel story the Holy Family had lost Jesus in the capital city of Jerusalem! This is a reminder that though Jesus' family is holy it was not without challenges, like any family. Joseph and Mary dealt with parenting a preteen who thought he was fine on his own. Obviously miscommunication was a challenge for them as it might be for us as well. It can be simple for us to imagine that the Holy Family was perfect, something to which we could never measure up. But Luke gives us a story of a family with real-life challenges and problems. In fact, this is a challenge we would not wish upon anyone, losing track of a child for days in a major city. Even so, such a story might give us hope as we deal with daily activities in family life, striving not for perfection, which is an unattainable ideal. But instead, we recognize that family life can be messy, punctuated with misunderstandings, miscommunication, and mistakes, Such events are not "sinful" and they were obviously part of life for the Holy Family. It is significant that Luke tells us not only that Jesus was obedient to his parents but that he also grew in wisdom. He was not born fully formed and all knowing. As a human being he naturally learned things. And simply reflecting on this fact can be the source of profound meditation on our part. We who believe that Jesus was divine also believe that he was human. He was not a divine puppet but a flesh-and-blood human being who was raised in a family and grew in wisdom. Our own families are places of sanctity. We will have challenges as the Holy Family did. But we can deal with them forthrightly, knowing that the relationships we have in this most basic human unit are a means of sanctification. Living Liturgy—year C



LIVING THE PASCHAL MYSTERY

The family has been called the "domestic church" as it is

the first encounter children have with the Gospel, and it is the dwelling place of faith and lived Christian relationships. But oftentimes we hear such ideas and think that a family must therefore be a place of perfection, and we all know from our own experiences that families (or churches for that matter) are anything but places of perfection. So the idea can be



daunting and seem unattainable. But Luke gives us an image of family life that might be more relatable. Even the Holy family had their share of challenges, and so we have hope for ourselves and our own family situations. We know from experience-confirmed by research-that we learn more by imitation and example than we do by preaching and teaching. In other words, one's actions speak more loudly than words. How we live the gospel message in the midst of family life says much more about our faith commitment than what we say about the Gospel. Our homes and families ought to be places of security, welcome, love, care, concern, and forgiveness. Speaking about such things does not mean as much as living them. The same can be said for the Holy Family. Their behaviors spoke more loudly than their words. Today on this feast of the Holy Family, we might pause to consider what message we convey by our actions.


