Infant Baptisms:


Registered parishioners are expected to complete a Baptismal Preparation program prior to scheduling a baptism. Baptismal preparation programs are offered 3 times a year. Next class:

Sacramental Prep Policy:

In compliance with Archdiocesan policy and recommendations for the preparation and reception of the Sacraments, St. Patrick requires that any candidate receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Eucharist must be actively involved in age appropriate Religious Education for a minimum of 1 year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacraments. The candidates must have regular attendance in our programs. Additionally, it will be expected that each candidate will continue to be involved in age appropriate classes and regularly attend weekend Mass during the period of Preparation for the Sacrament.

Marriage Policy

Please contact the Pastor at least **six months** prior to the wedding to ensure adequate time for these preparations.


PARISH OFFICE

REFLECTING ON THE GOSPEL

"Mange, mange!" the Italian grandmother said to her grandchild. The plate of homemade pasta was too good to simply sit there untouched. The grandmother encouraged the child to "eat, eat!" And so the grandchild did and soon there was nothing left but some stray noodles. It brought a smile to both faces. The feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ has its historical roots in thirteenth-century Belgium but it is celebrated worldwide today. Our reading comes from the Gospel of Luke. Though we might expect Luke's account of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper, we have, instead, the multiplication of the loaves. But of course, this episode is laden with eucharistic overtones, especially in the verbs used: taking, blessed, broke, and gave. These are the verbs used at the Last Supper, and the verbs we use today in our eucharistic liturgy. So even though we are not reading from the Last Supper, eucharistic theology is baked into the story of the multiplication of the loaves.

Recall that the evangelist Luke portrayed Jesus as an infant lying in a manger. The word manger is often misunderstood as a cozy, comfy place to set a sleeping baby. But a manger is actually a "feed-trough," as the root word, mange, indicates, It's the place from which the animals eat. Narratively speaking, Luke is showing that from infancy Jesus, placed in the feed-trough, is food for the world. In the concluding chapter of the Gospel of Luke, on the road to Emmaus the disciples will learn that after the resurrection they come to know Jesus in the breaking of the bread. And in the Acts of the Apostles, too, the apostle Paul is shown celebrating a meal with the breaking of the bread. So this eucharistic theology is not limited to the Last Supper. It permeates the Gospel of Luke and his Acts of the Apostles. How appropriate that we read from his gospel today, on the feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. We feast on the body of Jesus, food for the world. Mange, mange!

NEW FACILITY USE FEES FOR PRIVATE EVENTS

Starting **July 1, 2019**, St. Patrick Church will be increasing the fees for the use of our Parish Center. This will be for any parishioner who wishes to use our facility for a private event. This does not include any parish ministry meetings or events. We will no longer have a Janitorial Fee but will now have a Deposit of \$200.00 that will be refunded if you clean up after your event. If however our maintenance personal has to clean up after your event, there will be no refund. Our Facility Use Fee will be \$700.00 for all users. This fee includes the use of the Multipurpose room, auditorium, kitchen and bathrooms. When you rent our facilities you will have access to the following items for your use: Stove, Refrigerator, Ice Machine, New tables and chairs, restrooms and all cleaning supplies along with the above rooms. A "TULIP" (Tenant User Liability Insurance Program) Fee of \$105.00 will be taken out if your event has more than 50 people and/or you have alcohol at your event or at the discretion of the Pastor. TULIP provides the user with \$1 Million of General Liability Insurance and includes Host Liquor Liability coverage. If you have alcohol at your event, you will be required to abide by the OLCC guidelines at ALL TIMES. 


Coffee and Donuts after the 8:30a.m. Mass will take a hiatus during July and August to return in September.

LIVING THE PASCHAL MYSTERY

It's said by Christians that Jesus is food for the world. This reflects the eucharistic theology that is the core of Christian spirituality. Jesus himself is the bread broken and shared. This is prefigured by Luke when the infant Jesus lies in the manger. Though we consider often the paschal mystery, the Eucharist itself is the food for our journey to the paschal mystery. Jesus himself comes to us as the Bread of Life, food for the world, and satisfaction for the hungry. Now, after the resurrection, after his many appearances to his disciples, we come to know him in the breaking of the bread. The breaking implies and even foreshadows, the paschal mystery. The bread is not merely admired, but it is broken as Jesus himself is broken for us during the passion and death. In so doing, he becomes food for us, life-giving sustenance as we embark on the path to follow him.








ST. PATRICK'S INVITES KIDS TO ATHENS VBS!


