

REFLECTING ON THE GOSPEL

Matthew 20: 1-16a

There is an old joke about a Protestant being led around heaven by St. Peter. They pass a room and St. Peter says, "Be quiet around this room." To which the Protestant asks, "Why?" Peter responds, "In that room are the Catholics and they think they're the only ones here." Jesus was a master teacher. His parables inspired and they were remembered in part because they were simple stories that conveyed multiple layers of meaning. Each story seems to have a variety of possible entry points, as does today's gospel. Is the landowner truly just when he gives all the workers the same wage? What would unionized workers say about this practice? Why does the landowner distribute wages in the manner he does, with those who worked the longest receiving their pay last? Is he trying to incite a riot, or maybe inspire jealousy and envy? As of these questions and more may be conjured up by a quick reading of the parable. Not only was Jesus a master teacher, but we recall that he taught two thousand years ago! One challenge is that some of his stories are set deeply in the milieu of his context. The parable is not in fact making statements about modern labor law or the role of unions or day laborers instead, landowners in Jesus' time had incredible power over workers and over their property. Perhaps because there were no labor unions, guest worker programs, or labor laws to protect workers, the



landowner was able to act with impunity. This kind of power makes for an apt image of a powerful and unaccountable God! So Jesus uses the character of the landowner in the parable to say that God gives each his or her due at the very least, and he is generous. It is not up to us to tell God how and in what way he is to be generous with his resources. God gives to each what he will. Though not less than what he promised. In the early church this parable was often interpreted in terms of Jews and Gentiles, with Jews being the early workers and Gentiles being those who came late. God gives each a share of his kingdom. All will likely be surprised by the generosity of God and by who appears at the heavenly banquet. Ideally, no one group will think its members are the only ones to share in God's goodness. 
CHRISTIAN IN THE WORLD SERIES

It sounds strange to hear it said that someone is generous only with one group and not another. And such is the seeming riddle of today's parable.

God is a just and generous giver. When we receive what we have from God, there is no room for complaint, jealousy, and envy. The gifts of God are given to whom he will. Let us die to our own sense of who is just and worthy in God's sight and leave room to be surprised by his generosity. None of us can predict the actions of God.

SACRAMENT PREP POLICY

In compliance with Archdiocesan policy and recommendations for the preparation and reception of the Sacraments, St. Patrick requires that any candidate receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Eucharist must be actively involved in age appropriate Religious Education for a minimum of 1 year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacraments. The candidates must have regular attendance in our programs. Additionally, it will be expected that each candidate will continue to be involved in age appropriate classes and regularly attend weekend Mass during the period of Preparation for the Sacrament.

SACRAMENTS

Adult Baptism

Adults seeking baptism are expected to participate in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). RCIA begins in the fall with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation in the Spring (Easter). For information call the Office 503-266-9411

Infant Baptisms:

Registered parishioners are expected to complete a Baptismal Preparation program prior to scheduling a baptism. Baptismal preparation programs are offered 3 times a year.

Marriage Policy:

Please contact the Pastor at least **six months** prior to the wedding to ensure adequate time for these preparations.





Dear Fellow Parishioners,

While 2020 has been dramatically different due to COVID-19, many great things have been happening around Saint Patrick. The maintenance committee would like to highlight what has been happening to keep our parish facilities in shape for years to come.

* Five separate volunteer groups work diligently to maintain our parish grounds. Their dedication to this task has improved the overall look as well as created a savings for our parish. This group has four teams who rotate the weekly task of maintaining the lawn, garden beds and parking lot. The fifth group comes in on a regular basis to trim shrubs and tend to other plant related needs. Even though we have not had mass due to COVID-19, the dedication of this group has not waned.

*A group led by a landscape designer proposed a new landscape design for the front of the parish center to Father Arturo. After his approval and when COVID-19 restrictions we relaxed, this group began their project. With the help of an anonymous donor and the dedication of a small group volunteers the front of our Parish Center has had a dramatic transformation. New plants, a dry rock bed, irrigation and a bubbler will give us something to watch change over the seasons and years.

*A parishioner stepped forward to not only donate the funds but also to do the work for a renovation of the Parish Center conference room. New carpet and paint... Library has been moved down the hall to rooms 7 & 8. Please check it out when the center is open to the public again.

*In the summer of 2019, we had a safety audit by an independent company for the Archdiocese. Overall, we did very good. One of the issues brought to our attention is that we should not have anything stored in mechanical rooms that have electrical panels and furnaces. The committee has discussed building a storage building next to the church of the same size and style of the mechanical building for the church. A parishioner has come forward with a donation to make this happen.


*The front end and west wall of the parish center has been been resided including the upper walls of the center portion of the center. Along with new siding we have new windows and replaced the lower cover over the entry to the parish center. After the completion of some final details, the new siding will be painted. We are approximately \$2,500 short on the painting project.

*One of the additional details on the Parish Center that needs to be addressed is gutters along the upper wall of the center. This portion of the center has never had gutters which is not good for the lower roof. It has also caused damage to the fascia making it difficult to attach gutters. A couple from the parish have offer to pay for the fascia and whatever else is needed so gutters have a solid surface on which to be attached.

*Due to COVID-19, the Archdiocese has made the difficult decision to not fund the Safety-First Grant for 2020. Our application this year was to help with the cost of the front doors of the church. We will look at this project sometime in the future.

In summary, we have many projects happening in our parish and more to come. We are able to Accomplish these tasks through prayer, the great volunteers, and the generosity of the parish Community. If you would like to donate to these and future project, do not hesitate to make an extra donation to the Building Fund. 


