

# FOCUSING ON TODAY'S GOSPEL Luke 6:17, 20-26

«Rejoice in that day and leap for joy»

oday, , we review again the "beatitudes" and the "misfortunes: «Fortunate are you... when people hate you because of the Son of Man; But, ...alas for you who laugh now for you will mourn and weep». Fidelity to Christ and to his Gospel may make us to be rejected, insulted by the media, hated, as Christ was hated by those who crucified him. Some may think this is due to lack of faith, but maybe, after all, is just lack of reasoning. Indeed, it seems our world refuses to think or be free. We are immersed in a lust for pleas-



ure and riches; immersed in consumables; blinded by the libertarian indoctrination full of vain and empty words, which darken our personal standards and values and scorns the Church's and Christ's teachings, which is the only line of thinking that, right now, truly goes up stream. But, in spite of this, the Lord-Jesus still encourages us: «Fortunate are you who weep now, for you will laugh. Fortunate are you when people hate you, when they reject you and insult you and number you among criminals, because of the Son of Man. Rejoice in that day and leap for joy, for a great reward is kept for you in heaven» (Lk 6:22-23).

John Paul II The, in the encyclical Fides et Ratio, wrote: «Faith impels reason to leave its isolation and to advocate gladly for what is beautiful, good and true». The Christian experience, in its saints, show us the truth of the Gospel and of these words from Holy Father. Confronting a world that indulges in vice and selfishness as the only source of happiness, Jesus shows us another way: the happiness of the Kingdom of God, which our world finds so difficult to assume to the point of hating and rejecting it. Christians, in the midst of all temptations that this "easy life" offers, know the only way is the love Christ has shown for us in the Cross, the way of fidelity to the Father. # SACRAMENT PREP POLICY

In compliance with Archdiocesan policy and recommendations for the preparation and reception of the Sacraments, St. Patrick requires that any candidate receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Eucharist must be actively involved in age appropriate Religious Education for a minimum of 1 year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacraments. The candidates must have regular attendance in our programs. Additionally, it will be expected that each candidate will continue to be involved in age appropriate classes and regularly attend weekend Mass during the period of Preparation for the Sacrament.

# **Adult Baptism**

Adults seeking baptism are expected to participate in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). RCIA begins in the fall with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation in the Spring (Easter). For information call the Office 503-266-9411

Registered parishioners are expected to complete a Baptismal Preparation program prior to scheduling a baptism. Baptismal preparation programs are offered 3 times a year.



# GRACE AND PEACE IN CHRIST!

My name is Sr. Mary Joy, and I am a sister of the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity (SOLT). I have been a professed member of the community since 2011. My community is made of members of different vocations (priests and brothers, sisters, and laity) and we serve in areas of deep need, wherever the Church needs us.

I am currently serving at our mission in Benque Viejo, Belize, Central America, after spending nearly seven years in parish ministry in Phoenix, Arizona. It's a been a gift to come back here again, as is was my first assignment after first vows. My main apostolate is campus ministry at our high school here.

How does a religious vocation come out of our small community of St. Pat's in Canby in the unchurched Pacific Northwest? By the grace of God, truly! Although the foundation was very much present in my childhood, thanks to my parents, it was only by God's Providence that I came to be where I am today.

I am the second of three children, and my family was faithful in practicing the Catholic faith (but not exceptionally devout during those years). I

attended the Franciscan University of Steubenville and it was there that I encountered many young people living their faith in a very vibrant way and I was exposed to the idea of a religious vocation for the first time (but I did not think it was for me!). I also became very attracted to missionary work and went on multiple mission trips.

The summer after my sophomore year, after looking for volunteer opportunities, I ended up on the Turtle Mountain Reservation in North Dakota (served by SOLT) as a summer camp counselor. I experienced the Lord working in my heart in a new way, and I was profoundly impacted by the experience of living, serving, and praying in community. I loved the mission life there and the family spirit and Marian spirituality of SOLT. I returned to Franciscan University, and although I loved being there, I was surprised to find how deeply I missed the mission life I had experienced in North Dakota.

That fall was when I first felt called to be a sister, and specifically, to join SOLT. I wrestled with my vocation, as I felt like I was giving up my freedom, but eventually, I was able to accept that this was the path to happiness and holiness that the Lord desired for me. After graduating, I did mission work at the North Dakota mission for a couple of years and

then entered formation with the SOLT sisters. I found great peace in that first step, and while there have been challenges, as there are in all walks of life.

I am so grateful for this life! It is a great gift to experience



Jesus using me as a consecrated person to be a sign of His presence to others.

# Parish projects completed during 2020 and 2021

**Parish Center:** The parish center siding was replaced on the south and west side of the auditorium along with an upgrade of energy efficient windows. The front pillars of the center were trimmed with new facia. The upper level of the auditorium received new siding, facia and gutters.

**Pastor's House:** The pastor's house received an exterior update of siding and new windows. This project was possible due to generous donations of time and materials by various contractors in our parish.

**Parish Center Roof:** In an effort to extend the life of the parish center roof a few more years, the entire parish center roof, including the gym, was assessed in late spring and recommended repairs were completed this fall. These repairs will give us about four years to prepare for a total roof replacement.

Many other projects like the clean up after the ice storm, the regular grounds maintenance by a volunteer crew and the beautification in front of the parish center happen on a regular basis around our parish. It is through the generous donations of time, talent and treasure we are able to do all of these things for our parish family. Thank you!

# Parish Projects for 2022

(100% FUNDED) Storage Building: Due to a recommendation during a safety audit in 2019, we are working to build a storage building west of the church and north of the mechanical building for the church. The building will store the seasonal items we use in the church. The design will mirror the mechanical building. The cost for this project is estimated at \$8,700.

Main Church Entry Doors: The replacement of the entry doors to the church is a project which has been discussed for several years. Due to their age, sill plates and mechanisms are starting to catch and not function properly. The project will include replacing the current four doors with two wider doors and two side light windows. The doors will be ADA accessible with electronic openers inside and out. The cost for this project will be approximately \$27,000.

**Cemetery Water Purification:** For many years the cemetery has been plagued with iron in the water which stains the markers and headstones. A system has been researched that would eliminate this problem. The cost to help preserve the markers and gravestones is \$8,000.

Covered Area at the Cemetery: This will be used for graveside and memorial Masses at St Patrick Cemetery and assist in large groups and provide a permanent cover for ceremonies. As an added benefit, it will create less stress on the grass during the rainy season. Estimates and designs to be completed as soon as possible.

Columbarium at the Cemetery: There is currently a parishioner who would like to start a fund for columbarium at the cemetery. This will provide a space for cremains to be placed and be considerate of the amount of ground space being used. It can be built so it can be added to as new space is needed.

Please keep these projects in your prayers and if you are able, know that any donations will be put to good use. If you wish, you may designate your funds to go to a specific project or the building fund. If we receive more than needed for anyone project, it will be moved to the building fund. Thank you!



### Proyectos parroquiales realizados durante el 2020 y el 2021

**Centro Parroquial:** El revestimiento del centro parroquial fue reemplazado en el lado sur y oeste del auditorio junto con la instalación de ventanas de bajo consumo energético. Los pilares delanteros del centro se recortaron y se les instalo una facia nueva. El nivel superior del auditorio también recibió nuevos revestimientos, fascias y gutters.

Casa del Párroco: La casa del párroco recibió un revestimiento en el exterior y también ventanas nuevas. Este proyecto fue posible gracias a la generosa donacion de la mano de obra y materiales de varios miembros de nuestra parroquia.

Techo del centro parroquial: En un esfuerzo por extender la vida útil del techo del centro parroquial algunos años más, a finales de la primavera se realizó una evaluación de todo el techo del centro parroquial, incluido el gimnasio; las reparaciones recomendadas se completaron este otoño. Estas reparaciones nos darán alrededor de cuatro años para prepararnos para un reemplazo total del techo. Muchos otros proyectos como la limpieza después de la tormenta de hielo, el mantenimiento regular de las áreas verdes por parte de un equipo voluntario y el embellecimiento frente al centro parroquial que pasan de manera regular en nuestra parroquia se realizan por las generosas donaciones de tiempo, talento y tesoro de nuestra familia parroquial. iGracias!

# Proyectos Parroquiales para el 2022

(100 % DONADO) Edificio de almacenamiento: debido a una recomendación durante una auditoria de seguridad en el 2019, estamos trabajando para construir un edificio de almacenamiento al oeste de la iglesia y al norte del edificio mecánico de la iglesia. El edificio almacenara los artículos de temporada que usamos en la iglesia. El diseño será parecido al edificio mecánico. El costo de este proyecto se estima en \$8.700 dólares. Puertas de la Entrada Principal de la Iglesia: El reemplazo de las puertas de la entrada principal a la iglesia tiene un proyecto que se ha discutido durante varios años. Debido a su edad, las puertas y los mecanismos comienzan a atorarse y no funcionan correctamente. El proyecto incluirá la sustitución de las cuatro puertas actuales por dos puertas más anchas y dos ventanas de luz laterales. Las puertas serán accesibles según la ADA con chapas electrónicas por dentro y por fuera. El costo de este proyecto será de aproximadamente \$27,000 dólares.

**Purificación del Agua del Cementerio**: durante muchos afios, el agua del cementerio ha estado llena de hierro que mancha las tumbas y las lapidas. Se ha encontrado un sistema que elimina este problema. El costo para ayudar a preservar las tumbas y las lapidas es de \$8000 dólares.

Área Techada en el Cementerio: Esta área techada se utilizará para las ceremonias en el cementerio de San Patricio y ayudará a grupos grandes de personas proporcionando un techado permanente para las ceremonias. Como beneficio adicional, dañara menos el césped durante la temporada de lluvias. Las estimados y los diseños se darán a conocer lo antes posible.

Columbario en el cementerio: Actualmente hay un feligrés que le gustaría iniciar un fondo para construir un columbario con nichos en el cementerio. Esto proporcionara un espacio para las cenizas de los difuntos aprovechando al máximo la cantidad de espacio en el suelo del cementerio. Se puede construir a medida que se necesite más espacio.

Por favor ore por estos proyectos y si puede ayudar sepa que cualquier donacion será bien utilizada. Si lo desea, puede designar su donacion para un proyecto específico. Si recibimos más de lo necesario para un proyecto, se transferirá al fondo de general de construcción. ¡Muchas gracias!
