FOCUSING ON TODAY'S GOSPEL John 20,19-23

Receive the Holy Spirit

Today, the day of Pentecost, the fulfillment of the promise Christ made to the Apostles is finally accomplished. The evening of that Easter day He breathed on them and said to them: "Receive the Holy Spirit" (Jn 20:22). The Holy Spirit's arrival on the Day of Pentecost renews and brings this gift to plenitude in a solemn way and with external manifestations. Thus culminates the paschal mystery.

Jesus conveys the Spirit into the disciples to create a new human condition while producing unity. When man's arrogance made him think he could defy God by building the Babel tower, God mixed their languages so they could not understand each other any more. With the Pentecost, it just happens to be the contrary: on the grace of the Holy Spirit, people from the most varied origins and languages can understand the Apostles.


The Holy Spirit is the intimate and personal Master who guides the disciple towards the truth, who motivates him to do good, who consoles him in the pain, who transforms him intimately, while giving him a new strength and capacity.

The first day of the Pentecost of the Christian era, the Apostles were gathered around the Virgin Mary, while praying. The recollection and the praying attitude are necessary to receive the Spirit. "And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them" (Acts 2:2-3).

They remained full of the Holy Spirit and, bravely, they started to preach. Those fearful men had been transformed into courageous preachers unafraid of jail, torture or martyrdom. This should not surprise us, for the Holy Spirit's strength dwelt within them.

The Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, is my soul's soul, the life of my life, the entity of my entity; it is my sanctifier, the guest in my deepest interior. To reach maturity in a life of faith our relation with Him must be, time and again, more conscientious, more personal. In this celebration of the Pentecost we must have the doors of our interior life wide open.

SHEPHERDS FIELD OLIVE WOOD HANDCRAFTS

Shepherds Field Olive Wood will be visiting St. Patrick's next weekend, **June 11-12, 2022**.

They are a group from the Holy Land (Bethlehem & Jerusalem) who will be selling religious articles after masses to support the Catholic Christian minorities in Bethlehem. As a tradition, many of the Catholic families in the Holy Land work in small workshops to produce religious articles from

olive wood. These articles represent the Christian art of the Holy Land. In the past, they used to sell their artwork to pilgrims who visit the Holy Land. However, these days they are facing an economic hardship, as there are no tourists at all visiting the Holy Land due to the pandemic. Many of the Catholic families immigrated and left the Holy Land. The percentage of Christians in the Holy Land has dropped from 20% to less than 1%. Therefore, if this hardship continues as it is now, we believe that in a few years, there will be no Catholics in Bethlehem or Jerusalem. The struggle to preserve the Catholic identity of the birthplace of our savior; Jesus Christ is a serious concern for Catholics around the world. Sales will be used to help support the Catholics in the Holy Land and to encourage them not to immigrate."

SACRAMENT PREP POLICY

In compliance with Archdiocesan policy and recommendations for the preparation and reception of the Sacraments, St. Patrick requires that any candidate receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation, First Reconciliation and First Eucharist must be actively involved in age appropriate Religious Education for a minimum of 1 year prior to beginning preparation for the Sacraments. The candidates must have regular attendance in our programs. Additionally, it will be expected that each candidate will continue to be involved in age appropriate classes and regularly attend weekend Mass during the period of Preparation for the Sacrament.

SACRAMENTS

Adult Baptism:

Adults seeking baptism are expected to participate in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). RCIA begins in the fall with the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation in the Spring (Easter). For information call the Office 503-266-9411

Infant Baptisms:

Registered parishioners are expected to complete a Baptismal Preparation program prior to scheduling a baptism. Baptismal preparation programs are offered 4 times a year.


MARION VICARIATE CHANGES REGARDING RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

The clergy of the Marion vicariate has come to an agreement regarding Vicariate Policies in the conduct of preparing and guiding children, youth, and adults for Sacraments and for Faith formation. **These policies take effect this May 2022.** The Marion Vicariate includes Sacred Heart – St. Louis (Gervais), St. James (Molalla), St. Mary (Mt. Angel, Holy Rosary Mission – Scotts Mills), St. Paul (Silverton), St. Paul (St. Paul), St. Luke (Woodburn, St. Agnes Mission – Hubbard), and St. Patrick (Canby). The vicariate would like to see families select and become established in a “home” parish, meaning the parish you primarily attend. The home parish is fundamental in the parishioner’s life. Therefore, families that desire sacraments, want to enter faith formation, or request a Quinceañera, are required to be registered with their home parish. If you desire to receive the sacraments or Quinceañera outside your home parish, you will be required to present a letter of permission from the pastor of your home parish. St. Patrick parish registration forms can be found in the parish office. Other vicariate-wide changes include one form to certify that a godparent or sponsor is a “Catholic in Good Standing.” This form will need to be signed by the godparent or sponsor’s home parish pastor. The Sponsor Form can be found in the parish office or by visiting our website at stpatcanby.org. Finally, a notable change, will be the deadline or cut-off date to register for our religious education programs. **The vicariate has decided that registrations must be received prior to Labor Day weekend which is September 5th this year.** If you have not registered for our programs prior to that date, you will need to wait until the next program year. These policies and changes have been made in the spirit of providing the greater community with a consistent pastoral approach. The guidelines are made to encourage continued faith formation, evangelization, and catechesis with every step of your faith journey.

The FACTS ABOUT ABORTION----- DEBUNKING 10 COMMON MYTHS

Myth #1: Most abortions happen in the hard cases - incest, rape, maternal health problems, birth defects.

Fact: 97% happen because of social or economic reasons.

Myth #2: Access to abortions helps racial minorities.

Fact: Abortion is making our population more white. 28% of blacks are aborted, while only 10% of whites are aborted.

Myth #3: The fetus is just a clump of cells that's part of the mother's body.

Fact: The unborn child has its own genetic code from Day 1 and is defined by scientists as a distinct organism.

Myth #4: Planned Parenthood doesn't focus on abortion.

Fact: Planned Parenthood makes an estimated \$583,350.00 per day from abortions, at \$600.00 per abortion.

Myth #5: The use of contraception reduces the abortion rate.

Fact: Contraception induces a rise in promiscuity as people think they can have sex for recreation without conceiving, but contraception fails sometimes. As promiscuity rises, so does the number of unplanned pregnancies, and so does abortion rate.

Myth #6: Planned Parenthood often provides prenatal care and adoption referrals, and only some abortions.

Fact: 97% of clients at Planned Parenthood get abortions.

Myth #7: Thousands of women died every year from illegal abortions before abortions became legal.

Fact: The year before Roe Vs Wade, abortion caused only 65 maternal deaths. It is 4254% more common to die in a house fire.

Myth #8: Abortion can save a woman's life.

Fact: A woman whose life is in danger may need a medical procedure that kills her child as a side effect. But doctors agree that direct abortion is never necessary to save a woman's life.

Myth #9: There aren't very many abortions done each day.

Fact: There are an estimated 2,363 abortions done each day, and done at different times of gestation, even as late in some states up to full term abortions.

Myth #10: Most Americans are pro-choice.

Fact: Americans are split fairly evenly on the abortion issue with 48% Pro-Abortion and 46% Pro-Life and 6% undecided.






