Rejoice

Isaiah proclaims truly good news to us! God's coming brings not sadness, guilt, fear, wrath, or condemnation. No, God's

coming is a source of comfort and joy. Saying it once is not enough, for today's readings are full of joy. Mary's Magnificat substitutes for our psalm today, and our second reading encourages us to



rejoice, to give thanks and praise.

This is the root meaning of the Greek word for Eucharist. We are urged to rejoice and give thanks, because the coming of the Lord brings joy, healing, liberty, release, vindication. It makes the very earth spring up with new life! Good tidings!

The Shepherd Speaks: Deacon Gerald DuPont

Dear Holy People of God,

Several people have asked that I share the 10 Commandments of Forgiveness from last Sunday's homily. Remember, these are how we can strengthen our unity through dialogue as a people of Communion (Common-union) rather than leading to disunity within our community. So here they are.



- 1. Forgiveness is not easy. (No cheap grace. It takes time)
- 2. Forgiveness is not forgetting. (It is not denial or pretending nothing happened)
- 3. Forgiveness does not overlook Evil. (It is not accepting injustice or wrongs)
- 4. Forgiveness is not indifference. (It is not going back to business as usual)
- 5. Forgiveness is not the same thing as approval. (Can disagree with respect and dignity, never name calling)
- 6. Forgiveness recognizes that people are always bigger than their faults (Never define a person by their mistakes)
- 7. Forgiveness allows a person to start all over again. (We all need to start anew)
- 8. Forgiveness recognizes the humanity of the wrongdoer (As well as our part that contributed to the problem)
- 9. Forgiveness surrenders the right to get even (Revenge is bitter & destructive)
- 10. Forgiveness wishes the offender well (We wish them the Best)

My Dear People, we all want forgiveness – we all need forgiveness. But, as we find in the Gospels, we have to be able to give it first. That is the scary part. No forgiveness for others, no forgiveness for us. The Gospel start off with the desire for God's forgiveness at Advent and ends with bestowing it at Easter. But in between, as a necessary connection, a necessary condition to be a Christian stands the 10 Commandments of Forgiveness. So important, because it is how we can achieve Unity in our world, nation, and community. It is how we, this Advent, Prepare the Way of the Lord.
