TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

There was a curious custom years ago that perhaps developed in an age when Easter was seen less as a baptismal season than as a kind of tour through the deeds of the Risen Christ. The paschal candle, sign of Christ's presence, was removed from public view on Ascension Thursday, banished to the baptistery.

Ascension day does speak of the hidden aspects of Christ's life among us, but it does not have much to do with God's



absence. Christ has not shed his human life like an inconvenient shell, but rather has taken humanity into heaven. The theologian Karl Rahner said that it is a festival of "the nearness of God." In vanishing from our sight, Christ has become utterly available to all at every time and every place, and is "closer to us than he ever was."

Today is the feast of believing that beyond our final breath is a presence that waits for us, a banquet prepared, a tender homecoming embrace. Rahner said that today is a festival of the future of the world, a day for anticipating the world's true destiny, and therefore hardly a day to be going around hiding candles!

Dear fellow disciples,

We recognize, as a parish and as individuals, all too well, our sense of inadequacy to take up the mission of Jesus, handed on to us today in the Gospel. Each of us, despite our intentions to grow spiritually and be more courageous in living our faith, encounters the same inertia and obstacles to greater discipleship.

So, we need Pentecost. Only God can initiate the call to deeper growth. Only the Holy Spirit can guide us in the use of our natural gifts to effect supernatural results.

This coming week, between the Ascension and Pentecost, is a sort of "pregnant pause" in which to pray and open ourselves to the promise that God is sending in the Holy Spirit. If we offer God our hearts, as inadequate and fearful as we know them to be, God will fill us with insight and new possibilities. So much of discipleship is just getting up, showing up, doing our best, then trusting that God will take our small gifts and multiply them; trusting that the one to whom all power in heaven and on earth has been given will be with us always.

I hope that all of you can see, when you look in the mirror, a tiny flame flickering above your heads. I certainly can see it. You may not be a public speaker, but the word you proclaim as a lector is inspired by the Spirit – trust in God. You may not be holy enough to distribute the Body and Blood of Christ – but we ask God to send his Spirit upon the gifts we bring before him, including our own inadequate gifts, and make them holy – trust in God. Our own faith may be weak (like the eleven, we worship, but doubt we know enough to be a catechist), but Christ is with us in mission always – trust in God.

Pastoral Council, Social Ministry, CCW, Confirmation Preparation, RCIA, Choir, KOC, Octoberfest, the Deaconate, Finance Council, Hospitality, Sacristans, Youth Ministry, Bible Study, Alpha, and hundred ministries, some of which we haven't even thought of yet are waiting for you to put your inadequate gifts at the service of Christ's mission – trust in God. That flame is there! Catch fire!

Don't know how to get started? Really?? All you have to do is talk to one other person, and the two of you talk to someone else...eventually you'll get there. If you can't think of anyone else to talk to, talk to me or Deacon Gerald. Maybe we know a shortcut.

Queridos compañeros de discipulado,

Reconocemos demasiado bien, como parroquia y como individuos, nuestro sentido de insuficiencia para asumir la misión de Jesús, que nos ha sido entregada hoy en el Evangelio. Cada uno de nosotros, a pesar de nuestras intenciones de crecer espiritualmente y ser más valientes en vivir nuestra fe, encuentra la misma inercia y obstáculos para un mayor discipulado.

Entonces, necesitamos Pentecostés. Solo Dios puede iniciar el llamado a un crecimiento más profundo. Solo el Espíritu Santo puede guiarnos en el uso de nuestros dones naturales para lograr resultados sobrenaturales.

Esta próxima semana, entre la Ascensión y Pentecostés, es una especie de "pausa preñada" para orar y abrirnos a la promesa que Dios envía en el Espíritu Santo. Si ofrecemos a Dios nuestros corazones, tan inadecuados y temerosos como sabemos que son, Dios nos llenará de perspicacia y de nuevas posibilidades. La gran parte del discipulado consiste simplemente en levantarse, presentarse, hacer lo mejor que podamos y luego confiar en que Dios tomará nuestros pequeños dones y los multiplicará; confiando en que aquel a quien se ha dado todo poder en el cielo y en la tierra, estará siempre con nosotros.

Espero que todos ustedes puedan ver, cuando se miren en el espejo, una pequeña llama parpadeando sobre sus cabezas. Ciertamente puedo verlo. Puede que no seas un orador público, pero la palabra que proclamas como lector está inspirada por el Espíritu: confía en Dios. Puede que no seas suficientemente santo para distribuir el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, pero le pedimos a Dios que envíe su Espíritu sobre los dones que le presentamos, incluidos nuestros propios dones inadecuados, y que los haga santos: confía en Dios. Nuestra propia fe puede ser débil (como los once, adoramos, pero dudamos que sepamos lo suficiente para ser catequistas), pero Cristo está siempre con nosotros en misión: confía en Dios.

Consejo Pastoral, Ministerio Social, CCW, Preparación para la Confirmación, RICA, Coro, KOC, Fiesta de Octubre, Diaconado, Consejo de Finanzas, Hospitalidad, Sacristanes, Ministerio Juvenil, Estudio Bíblico, Alpha y cientos de ministerios, algunos de los cuales ni siquiera hemos pensado aún te esperan para que pongas tus dones inadecuados al servicio de la misión de Cristo: confía en Dios. ¡Esa llama está ahí! ¡Incendiarse!

¿No sabes cómo empezar? ¿¿En realidad?? Todo lo que tienes que hacer es hablar con otra persona, y los dos hablan con alguien más... eventualmente llegarás allí. Si no puede pensar en nadie más con quien hablar, hable conmigo o con el Diácono Gerald. Tal vez conocemos un atajo.
