Lenten Regulations for 2019

Weekdays of Lent: There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.



Good Friday: This is a day of **Abstinence from meat and Fasting**. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal for those between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive.

Days of Abstinence: (All Fridays in Lent)

All who have reached their 14th year are bound to abstain totally from meat.

Easter Duty Obligation: After they have received their First Holy Communion, Catholics are bound by the obligation of receiving Holy Communion at least once a year. This precept should be fulfilled during the Easter Season. Catholics are also bound to confess serious (mortal) sins at least once a year, but this is not limited to the Lenten/Easter Season.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

GOSPEL: Luke 6:39-45

The Transfiguration of Jesus is an epiphany story. In epiphany stories, the veil which separates the invisible world from the visible, and the future from the present, is removed temporarily and the divine is revealed. In the Transfiguration story, Peter, James and John catch a glimpse of Jesus in his glory. In today's Gospel, Jesus goes with his inner circle to pray. During his prayer on the mountain, Jesus has a mystical experience. God's presence is revealed to him in a very powerful way. "While he was praying, his face changed in appearance." Then the two giants of Israel's religion appear: Moses (symbolizing the Law) and Elijah (symbolizing the Prophets). They "spoke of his Exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" – a reference to Jesus' passage through death to new life. For Jesus, he knows He must proceed to Jerusalem for God's plan to be fulfilled. For Jesus, he knows he must proceed to Jerusalem for His Father's plan to be fulfilled. For the Apostles, it is a moment of revelation. The One in their midst is truly God's Chosen One! They must listen to him and follow him. They will of course only recognize the full meaning of this awe-filled event after Jesus has passed through death into new life. What an awe-inspiring foreshadowing of Jesus' Resurrection to come!



Besides celebrating St. Joseph's feast with the traditional St. Joseph Table this weekend, March 17th, is widely accepted as the date of St. Patrick's death in A.D. 461., and therefore we acknowledge St. Patrick's Day today as well.

St. Patrick is patron saint and national apostle of Ireland who is credited with successfully bringing Christianity to Ireland.

Was there really a St. Patrick? Definitely. Did he really drive the snakes out of Ireland? Probably not, since snakes weren't native to Ireland.

St. Patrick was born in Britain as Maewyn Succat. At age 16

(around A.D. 400), he was kidnapped from his home on the west coast and carried off to Ireland to become a slave who worked as a shepherd. After six years, he escaped; upon returning home, he received his call (in a dream) to preach the Gospel. He spent the next 15 or so years in a monastery, preparing for his missionary work. Although some Christians lived in Ireland at the time, it was Patrick who spread Christianity throughout the land and brought an organized church into existence.

We wear a shamrock on St. Patrick's Day because, legend says, St. Patrick used its three leaves to explain the Holy Trinity. (The Trinity is the Father, the Son, and the Spirit as three divine persons who are one divine being [God].) The truth of this legend, however, is in question, as there is no direct record that the saint actually used the shamrock as a teaching tool.
