

7 Ways to Pray During Lent ---Loyola Press

When we have an upcoming big event, we prepare for it. Holy Week and Easter are "big events" in the liturgical year of the Church and in the spiritual life of a Christian. So we prepare spiritually for these through the forty days of Lent, when we rededicate ourselves to prayer.

Here are a few prayer method ideas to jump-start this:

- 1. **Make your fasting a prayer-in-action.** We are called to give up something for Lent. Make what you're giving up for Lent a prayer as well. When you encounter the thing you are abstaining from or the time of day that you would normally enjoy it, say a prayer in recognition of your wholeness in God even without the thing you have given up, and thank God for the freedom to be wholly yourself without this.
- 2. **Pray the Stations of the Cross.** This prayer helps us reflect on the passion and death of Christ.
- 3. **Meditate on Holy Scripture with** *Lectio Divina*. *Lectio Divina* is rooted in the belief that the scriptural word speaks in the human heart as the word of God and can reveal the thoughts of our hearts in response to God.
- 4. **Reflect deeper on your liturgical prayer.** When you attend Mass during Lent, be conscious of and meditate on the words you pray in the liturgy.
- 5. **Join or start a prayer group.** There are many benefits to praying with others!
- 6. **Pray with children or as a family.** Share your faith by letting others see and hear you pray, and by praying together.
- 7. Use Lent as a time to instill a daily prayer habit that will last long after Lent has concluded.

Just try one or two of these prayer methods to concentrate on—and then you can more fully experience the pilgrim journey toward Easter that is Lent.
