# **January 14, 2018 Second Sunday In Ordinary Time**

#### On Liturgical Colors at Funerals

Over the last few weeks we've have mourned the deaths of several parishioners, and celebrated Masses for them here in church. The Church's prayers at the time of death encompass many themes: prayers for the souls of those who have died, our sure and certain hope in the Resurrection, and sorrow at the loss felt by those who remain in this present life. These different needs for which we pray manifest themselves not only in the words of prayers, but also in the different colors of liturgical vestments used at Mass.

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the instructions concerning how to celebrate Mass that priests are given in that big red book that sits on the altar) says that "Besides the color violet, the colors white or black may be used at funeral services and at other Offices and Masses for the Dead in the Dioceses of the United States of America" (346). These each manifest a different part of the Church's concerns at the time of death.

#### Violet

Violet or purple vestments are used during Lent, when Christians do penance for our sins and enact resolutions to become more perfect. When Violet vestments are used at a funeral, it reminds us of our need to pray and do penance for the souls of the faithful departed. They, too, are becoming more perfect. We know that in Heaven we will be perfect—we will no longer sin, or even be tempted to sin. I don't know about you, but when I try to imagine myself totally free from the grip of sin ... a lot needs to change in my soul between now and Heaven! This change where we go from being a sinner to being a saint in Heaven is what the dead in Christ undergo, a process of cleansing (or purgation) traditionally called Purgatory. The Church had always prayed for the dead, and many prayers of the funeral liturgy remind us of our need to continue to pray for our loved ones, even when they have died.

# White

In many Asian cultures, white is the traditional color of mourning. It is for this reason that white vestments were first allowed to be used at funerals. In the West, this color of vestment—used during the Easter season—also reminds the faithful of Christ's victory over death, and the promise of immortality to come. At the time of the death of a loved one, many people come face-to-face with eternal realities, and the Church's prayers at the funeral Mass and at the graveside encourage Christians to remember their faith in Christ's promise that He went before us to Heaven in order to prepare a place for us.

Since I've been a priest, it's been not at all unusual for me to find myself at two or three funerals a week. And from my experience, I'd say that black remains the color that people wear most often when attending a funeral. Black is a color of sorrow, of sadness, of loss. We feel these things at death, even as a people with faith in eternal life, because (as we read in the Scriptures, in the Book of Wisdom)

"God did not make death, and he does not delight in the death of the living" (1:13). The use of black vestments is a sign of the fact that the Church follows St. Paul's exhortation to "weep with those who weep" (Romans

So if you see any one of these three colors at a funeral Mass, call to mind the Church's intention for her departed children—and let us all pray for the living and the dead!
