


From Fr. Miller

Gaudete Sunday is always a joy for me. I'm not a huge fan of rose-colored vestments (they're not pink!) in general, but perhaps you will appreciate the one I wear this weekend. It was a gift from a friend and future priest and his family one on the occasion of my ordination to the priesthood. Authentic joy may be so rare in our society, that our senses need this visual reminder of it's uncommon presence among us. Our second reading from Philippians 4:4-7 reminds us to "rejoice in the Lord always, I shall say it again: rejoice." For many of us, rejoicing is hard this time of year. The virus and other worldly concerns dampen our spirits. We may recall family members or loved ones we have lost and the holidays are tough without them. But joy is not a product of circumstance, but of the presence of God's grace. May we receive the gift of authentic joy, something far more than an emotion, an Advent gift that will bless us year-round.

Canalside XMass

Each year there are many wonderful events here in our village. Our parish is grateful to have been able to participate in Christmas on the Canal on 12/5. We rang our church bells at 5p for five minutes, after the Christmas Tree was lit at Fireman's Field. As carolers were coming by Amity St., we opened up the doors to the Church, had all the inside lights on, and even some impromptu signs with our Christmas Mass schedule

and welcoming messages for the carolers. Not sure if anyone noticed, but our Advent Wreath was outside as a decoration, too. OCIA/RCIA



If you're not Catholic and would like to explore the Catholic faith, perhaps even be Baptized, Confirmed, and receive 1st Holy Eucharist, please contact us. The process formerly known as RCIA was recently re-named by the US Bishops to OICA, the Order of Christian Initiation of

Adults. Technically, OCIA/RCIA is for non-baptized or non-Catholic persons seeking Sacraments of Initiation. But practically speaking, many adult Catholics who never were Confirmed join us in the process of instruction, prayer, and fellowship. Our group meets every Sunday at 9a in the parish offices. 
