

Have you ever seen a celebrity? Have you ever met a political representative? Did the encounter leave you with newfound acting or musical abilities? Did it give you a grasp of the intricacies of the latest city ordinance or controversial law?

Talents, expertise, and skill are hard-won traits, not rewards that spread by contact. Our life of faith is also not so easy.

"We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets!" In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus notes that it requires moral strength to enter the kingdom of God. It's not mere proximity to righteousness that saves. Rubbing elbows with the righteous is not the same as being truly holy ourselves. Unfortunately, we can have this attitude in many areas. It's easy to see who may seem "first" in the eyes of the world. This occurs in our workplaces and among our public figures. It can also happen in our schools, local parishes, and the larger Church. For some of us, the temptation to have the popularity and prestige rub off on us can be fairly strong. If only we are in the right place with the right people, surely others will associate us with what they possess!

But salvation is worked out in each individual life. It is our task not merely to show up, but to be transformed. And the truly transformed may not be everyone we expect. "People will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south... some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." Some who seem first in reputation now may be last in the kingdom of God. Others who appear now on the furthest fringes of society - but better imitate the lowly holiness of Jesus - will be first in his kingdom. What are your concerns? Proximity and reputation? Or prayerful righteousness?



A SUMMER PROJECT: GOING GREEN!



This summer, Holy Redeemer finished a project many months in the works. After 8 months of collecting multiple bids, working with the Archdiocese on contract reviews, and getting the approval of our Parish Finance Council, we have completed a major undertaking. As you walk through the halls, the Mezzanine, the Four Seasons Room, the offices, and the classrooms, you may notice a difference in the lighting. Over the course of the summer, we have replaced the old lighting in those spaces with new, green, energy-efficient LED lighting with features like dimmers and motion detectors.

The total cost for this project was approximately \$65,000. But with a PEPCO rebate of about \$25,000, the total amount that Holy Redeemer actually spent was less than \$40,000 which we will recoup in savings in approximately two years time. We also get the added comfort of knowing that we are substantially reducing our future electric bills while doing our part in helping the environment by saving energy.

SUNDAY SCHOOL OF RELIGION REGISTRATION IS CURRENTLY UNDERWAY!



The first day of School of Religion for the 2019-2020 School Year will be on Sunday, September 8, 2019. Registration forms for families who were in the program last year have been mailed.

School of Religion is a faith-formation program of instruction in the Catholic faith for all children of the parish in preschool (three and four year olds) through 8th grade. Members of our parish community are trained as catechists and teach age-appropriate faith curriculum in a class-room setting. An integrated program of sacramental preparation is provided for Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation along with foundational catechesis. Members of our parish who have children enrolled in public or private schools in the area, along with Holy Redeemer School families, are welcomed and encouraged to enroll their children in our School of Religion program.

Our program begins each September and runs through mid-May, meeting on most Sundays except for major holidays. Preschool and Kindergarten School of Religion classes begin at 9:50 a.m. and run through the 10:00 a.m. Mass. 1st grade through 8th grade classes begin with the 10:00 a.m. Mass, and class begins after Mass and runs until 12:30 p.m.

Registration Forms & fees are due by Sunday, August 25th. Fees will increase after that date.

Families can register online on the Parish website at https://parish.holy-redeemer.org/school-of-religion or find downloadable forms to fill out and return. Registration Forms can also be found on the Parish Bulletin Board by the Mezzanine restrooms and in the literature racks at the entrances of the church.






