Opportunity at **Pioneer Square**: Catholic Charities Housing of Pullman

- Anna McHugh: Housing and Social Services Coordinator at Pioneer Square
 - o Currently the only Catholic Charities housing in Pullman area
 - Two other facilities in Clarkston and Walla Walla
 - o Forty-five-unit facility that houses the elderly and disabled
 - o All residents are on Social Security

 - Hygiene needs
 - Food Needs Shelf-stable
 - Housewares such as pots & pans; dishes; flatware; etc. (must be re-useable items)

<u>LEGISLATIVE activities</u>: Francy gave a short report about taking legislative action

Move Out Pitch In Update:

- Discussions: WSU Housing; Center for Civic Engagement; Campus Sustainability & Sacred Heart
 - Instruction document found from 2017 that spells out the MOPI program completely.
 - Using the instruction document, MOPI may be organized again for April/May 2024.
 - o Things have changed at WSU and in organizations that can participate:
 - Sacred Heart will collect from the Hill Halls which are now three instead of previous five.
 - Security in halls has increased; so, will need a student to walk with us twice a day to collect items from McClosky; Duncan Dunn/Community and Honors.
 - WSU will need to provide collection containers, strong plastic bags; and publicity for the students to know where to deposit items they are discarding.
 - Collection will start possibly April 25/26 and 27 and through Finals week, Saturday May 4; with a final pickup on Monday May 6.
 - These plans are still in process...
 - Francy will check her list for past volunteers from Sacred Heart. Other churches will also be contacted for more collection volunteers & Intersectional Advocacy Coalition will be invited as well.
 - Volunteers will be needed. Please contact Francy is you would like to join this recycling event.
 - It was suggested that possibly Fraternities/Sororities could adopt one residence hall to collect items once or twice a
 day and take the donations to Boost/Palouse Treasures, which would be very helpful for broadening the collection
 of MOPI at WSU.
 - Students also volunteered to take all food to Cougar Pantry.
 - Some items may be given directly to Pioneer Square.
- Next MOPI planning meeting will be 10 am on March 4 by Zoom.
