Refugee Resettlement Update: New Afghan Refugee family coming to Pullman

- **Kate Hellmann of WSU** informed us of another Afghan refugee family headed to Pullman by the end of March. The family consists of a mother, father, 5-year-old boy and 4-month-old girl.
- An apt. has been lined up for the first 2 to 3 months but then they will need to find other housing.
- The family will need support from the community for food, furniture, toys, books, clothing and whatever else the family needs.
- A point person has been identified to coordinate with a person at WSU who will help the family in determining what their needs are. Instead of doing a 'blitz' for goods like what happened with the first two families, it will be a specific list of needs so we don't end up with lots of unused items.
