  - o Ideas: New water heaters, solar panels, ? KC's talking about buying & installing a new 'shed' for storing recyclables
  - Present to the Parish Council

NEIGHBORS IN DIALOGUE Tim updated the plans for the next presentation:

- Program on Racism issue scheduled for Fall 2024 (October). Start organizing in August
- A panel discussion with CCUCC's Justice and Witness Ministry at CCUCC, one night
- Topic- How do we address racism problems that we encounter?
- Will include THREE PRESENTERS: (Rob (Kenyan who runs group care homes in Pullman) Trymaine (WSU & City Council) also if available and two local women (one a Para in school district, her daughter who works at WSU)

## Refugee Resettlement Update:

- The Afghan family, which was scheduled to arrive, has not gotten their VISAs, so they have not arrived in Pullman
- Housing is being provided by WSU for 2-3 month initially, and thereafter WSU International will find other housing
  - An article will be in the bulletin to encourage donations to the "endowment at WSU for the ESL Language classes" (UNIFEX Fund). More donations are needed. Anyone can contribute: Checks payable to Washington State University

  - A new trailer has been purchased for transporting beds, etc.to the host churches

- TREX
  - o On schedule to receive our next bench after collection of 1000 lbs. of plastic
