  - C. Parishioners have been encouraged to donate 'most needed items or cash. As of 1/29/25 there was \$2,048.99 in the Parish Food Pantry Fund.
  - D. More help is needed! Contact Sue if at all interested; the more volunteers, the less often it needs to be done!
    - 1.Restock the distribution shelves from the storage closet inventory
    - 2. Inventory storage shelves in the closet and alert what needs to be purchased & place non-shelved items on shelves in storage room as space allows
    - 3. Shoppers to go to various local stores to get the items at the cheapest prices
    - 4. Organizer/Communicator to keep track of shelves & request shoppers to purchase things as needed
