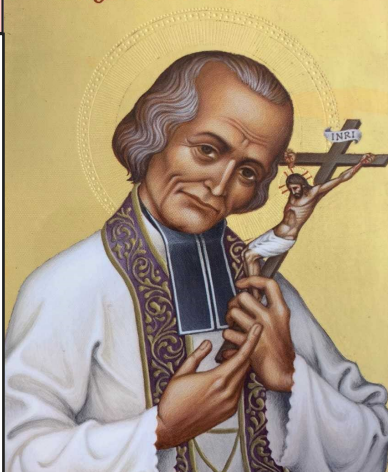

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

Praise God who gifts us with His very self under the appearance of bread and wine! This Sunday we celebrate Corpus Christi (Latin for the *Body of Christ*). The bishop updated his Decree last week and we are moving into the next phase, Phase C, for re-opening the parishes. Thus, we are able to have adoration this Sunday on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ from 11:30am-3:00pm. We will also resume our daily adoration schedule beginning June 15th. Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament is a beautiful act of prayer. Here are some reasons for taking part in Adoration.



- Adoration has a transforming effect. *"In gazing in adoration at the consecrated Host, we discover the gift of God's love, we discover Jesus' Passion and Cross and likewise his Resurrection. It is precisely through our gazing in adoration that the Lord draws us towards him into his mystery in order to transform us as he transforms the bread and the wine."* (Pope Benedict XVI, Nov. 17, 2010)
- You will better know your Savior whom you love, *"One cannot know the Lord without the habit of adoring, of adoring in silence. I believe, if I am not mistaken, that this prayer of adoration is the least known among us, it is the one we do the least, as if it were a 'waste of time before the Lord, before the mystery of Jesus Christ'. Instead, we should rediscover 'the silence of adoration: he is the Lord and I adore him'"* (Pope Francis, Oct. 20, 2016).
- Jesus pleads for companionship. In the Gospels the only time Jesus asked His friends anything for Himself occurred during His Agony: *"Jesus said to them, 'Could you not watch one hour with me?'"* (Mt 26:40).

In accord with the bishop's Decree, we will also be able to resume the public celebration of daily Mass. Our regular daily Mass schedule will resume on Monday, June 15th with Mass being at 6:00pm that day. Social distancing will still take place at daily Mass. Face masks are optional for daily Mass.

We are in the process of slowly re-opening the parish. For the next three weeks until July 4th, we will have limited office hours. The parish office will be open on Mondays and Wednesdays from 2:00pm-5:00pm. The parish office will be open on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 9:00am-12:00pm.

A reminder that the Saturday Vigil Mass at 4:30pm is for the vulnerable. Please recall that Bishop Doherty has given a dispensation to all the faithful in the diocese from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass until August 15. Please remember to keep each other in prayer as we endure through these days! Come Holy Spirit!

Saint Joseph Cafasso June 17

Even as a young man, Joseph loved to attend Mass and was known for his humility and fervor in prayer. After his ordination, he was assigned to a seminary in Turin. There he worked especially against the spirit of Jansenism—an excessive preoccupation with sin and damnation. He used the works of Saint Francis de Sales and Saint Alphonsus Liguori to moderate the rigorism popular at the seminary.



Joseph recommended membership in the Secular Franciscan Order to priests. He urged devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and encouraged daily Communion. In addition to his teaching duties, Joseph was an excellent preacher, confessor, and retreat master. Noted for his work with condemned prisoners, he helped many of them die at peace with God.

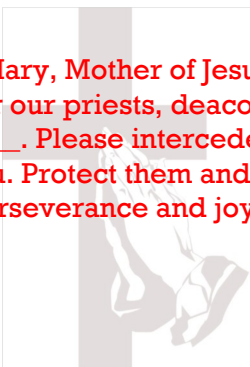
Joseph urged one of his former pupils—Saint John Bosco—to establish the Salesians congregation to work with the youth of Turin. Joseph Cafasso died in 1860, and was canonized in 1947. His Liturgical Feast Day is June 23.

PARISH UPDATES

COVID-19 Current Updates

Per Bishop Doherty's Decree from June 4, the following are changes affecting SJV in an effort to protect the safety of all our parishioners.

- Currently, everyone is dispensed from the obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation until **August 15**.
- **Daily Mass** will be offered beginning **Monday, June 15 at 6:00pm** and returning to our regularly scheduled daily Masses.
- Beginning **Monday, June 15** we will return to our normal **Adoration and Confession** schedules.
- Those persons who are 65 and older and those with underlying medical conditions are urged not to attend any liturgies or sacraments at this time.
- The **Saturday 4:30pm Vigil Mass at SJV will be specifically for those who are vulnerable** to protect them from unnecessary interaction with the healthier/non-vulnerable population. This Mass will be live streamed online at the St. John Vianney Catholic Church YouTube channel.
- Sunday Masses will be at **8:00am** and **10:30am**. Face masks are optional at these Masses.
- Holy Water will not be in the fonts. However, you may take Holy Water from the tank if you so desire.
- The Sign of Peace will not be exchanged during Mass.
- The Precious Blood will not be distributed at Mass until further notice.
- The distribution of Holy Communion will occur immediately after Mass. After a person receives Holy Communion, they are to exit the church and make their prayer of thanksgiving outside. Remember you are a walking tabernacle at that time! This will assist with social distancing and the disinfecting of the church after Mass.
- Social Distancing of 6-feet has been taken into consideration and thus limits the occupancy of persons in the church to about **20% normal occupancy**. Family members can sit together.
- Face masks are required for the Saturday 4:30pm Mass and are optional for the 8:00am and 10:30am Sunday Mass. Face masks are optional for daily Mass.

Reserving a Pew Section at Mass

In an effort to maintain social distancing, our church cannot be filled to capacity at this time. We do not want to have to turn away people wishing to come to Mass because we have already reached capacity. Thus, we will be using an online tool called **Eventbrite** to allow people to reserve a spot for Mass. The link to this tool will be available on the parish website at sjvfishers.com. Simply click the header image on the home page reading: 'Reserve a Spot for Mass'.

Some important reminders:

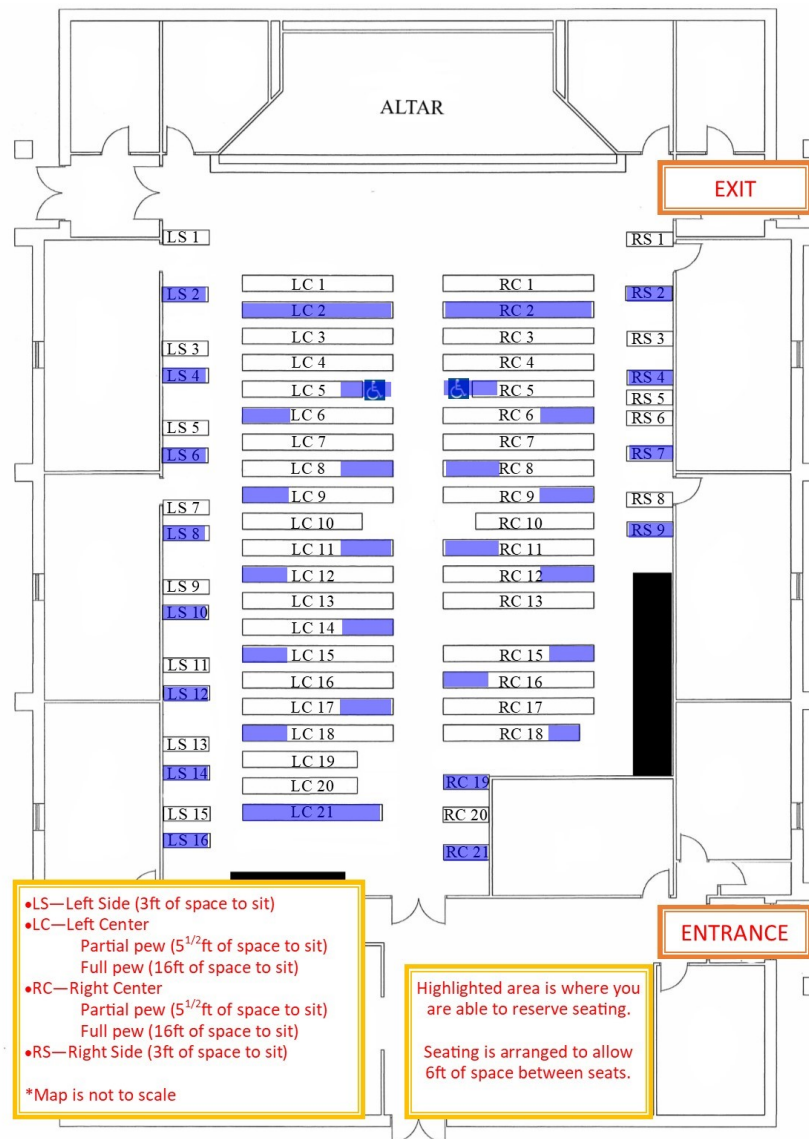
- You can only begin to reserve a pew section beginning at 7:00pm the Monday prior to the intended weekend.

CHECK YOUR PARISH'S PROTOCOLS

Each parish will have slightly different guidelines and procedures when it comes to registration, entering and exiting the church, distribution of Holy Communion, etc. Check your parish's website or call the main office before heading to your first Mass as we begin our phases of returning to worship.

2

PREPARE YOUR CHILDREN

While our experience returning to Mass will be different (social distancing in pews, no music), we want to emphasize the continuity with what came before. Remind children that we participate in the Mass in order to offer worship and thanksgiving to God. Review your family's behavior expectations for Mass. Explain that everyone will be wearing masks and practice wearing your own. (Little ones who can't understand the importance of mask wearing are not expected to keep a mask on, although it doesn't hurt to see if they will wear one.)

3

PACK LIGHT AND FOR CLEANLINESS

Choose board books and plastic toys to keep little ones occupied during the Mass, as they are easier to wipe down and disinfect than fabric items. As Communion will be distributed after Mass, and the faithful will leave directly after receiving, make sure your items fit in a bag that you can easily bring with you in the Communion line.

4

AVOID DRINKS BEFORE MASS

While restroom facilities will be available, you'll only want to use them in an emergency. Encourage children to use the bathroom before you leave. (And if you have that one child who always has to go 2 minutes before Mass starts, don't take no for an answer!)

IF IT'S A RISK, STAY AT HOME

The dispensation from participation in Sunday Mass has been extended through mid-August. If you are pregnant, have children with pre-existing conditions that make them more vulnerable, or just don't feel comfortable, feel free to stay at home and pray as a family or watch a live-streamed Mass.

Prayer to Overcome Racism: From the USCCB

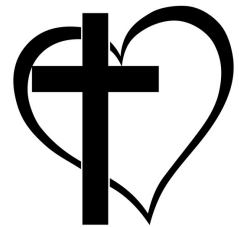
Mary, friend and mother to all, through your Son, God has found a way to unite himself to every human being, called to be one people, sisters and brothers to each other.
