Note From The Pastor



Coming out of the Pandemic Hibernation

Maybe you have seen in the news, the warning about the cicadas. Soon, when the soil temperature reaches 64 degrees, the 17-year cicadas (brood X) will come up from the ground. They have spent the last 17 years in the ground, hidden and growing. I don't know what it's like to emerge from 17 years in the ground, but it feels like we are beginning to surface after 14 months of being buried in the pandemic. To differing degrees, we have been away from the daylight of socializing and routine life. Slowly, we are beginning to arise.

The process of coming out of the pandemic is slow, complicated and will involve starts and stops. As more people are vaccinated and the virus makes its way through the population, the effects of the virus are slowing. We are already seeing a significant decline in hospitalizations and deaths. We are also experiencing more people returning to Mass and parish activities. Many people have shared that they feel more comfortable now that they have been vaccinated or a vulnerable loved one has been vaccinated. This doesn't mean the pandemic is over. That is why we will have a slow return to pre-pandemic practices and routines. These are small steps, but we thank God for the hope they bring.

One small step we will be taking beginning next weekend (May 8 & 9) is resuming the passing of the collection basket. According to the CDC, the principle mode by which people are infected with COVID-19 is through exposure to respiratory droplets that carry the virus. The risk from exposure through surfaces or objects is considered low (CDC Science Brief - April 5, 2021). It is still a good practice to sanitize your hands after touching surfaces that receive frequent contact. We will continue to provide hand sanitizer in Church and encourage frequent hand washing. Of course, you need not contribute via the collection basket. There still remains the option to contribute outside your visit to Church through bill pay at Holy Spirit and online giving at St. John Vianney. Regardless of how you contribute, we are grateful for your support.

Taking up the collection is one of the duties of the ushers. Serving as an usher is an important ministry. It is relatively simple and low-profile, but essential. We are in need of ushers at both parishes. You may also simply contact either parish office and leave your contact information and your desire to serve as an usher.

As we continue to welcome more people back to Church, we will adjust some physical distancing requirements at some Masses. I do ask that we all try to be respectful of those who are still at greater risk or are more vulnerable. We do have Masses at each parish where masks are required.

I want to take this opportunity to mention how grateful I am to our staff, volunteers and liturgical ministers at both parishes. These have been challenging times with a lot of extra work. The staff, volunteers and liturgical ministers have been dedicated to their ministries of assisting in our worship and celebration of the sacraments. We could not do it without them. Please take the opportunity to thank them.

An often asked question regarding our emerging from the pandemic is, "when will we return to congregational singing?" I am not sure. I am waiting for the directives from the bishop's office. Still, it is good to hear that so many people are anxious to sing at Mass. I share and understand the desire. While we haven't been silent for 17 years, I imagine once we are all gathered and singing in full voices it will be as loud as the cicada buzz.
