Note From The Pastor



Happy Father's Day!

A little over a week ago, the priests of the Diocese gathered for Convocation and to take part in some ongoing education. The topic was our identity as priests as taught by the church. In particular, we reflected on the teachings of St. John Paul II's

Theology of the Body and how that shapes who we are as priests. One essential aspect of priestly identity is fatherhood. Let me share some thoughts on what we heard and what our faith teaches about fatherhood.

We all need fathers. We need men who can teach, protect, and love from a masculine perspective. Boys need fathers to learn how to be men. Girls need fathers to learn how to relate to boys (and then men). This is not to diminish the role of mothers. God created us male and female, each with distinct gifts and capabilities. Who we are as a male or female, as created by God in his image, is a gift that has meaning. We are called to discover and share the gifts of who we are as a man or woman. Men's gifts are oriented toward fatherhood – whether they are biological fathers or not. Even Jesus needed someone as his earthly father, St. Joseph. Joseph demonstrates the need for fathers and is a model for understanding fatherhood. St. John Paul II noted, *"In this family [the Holy Family], Joseph is the father: his fatherhood is not one that derives from begetting offspring; but neither is it an 'apparent' or merely 'substitute' fatherhood. Rather, it is one that fully shares in authentic human fatherhood."* (*Redemptoris Custos*, 21). All men are called to be an authentic father or father figure to others.

Human fatherhood is flawed and limited. Most of us, in one or way or another, have some negative or imperfect experiences of a father or father figure. That is human nature. In addition, we also live in a time of challenge for fatherhood. Pope Francis recently wrote about the crisis we are experiencing in regard to fatherhood. He identifies a core aspect of the crisis is the idea of what a father is all about – even the idea of manhood is called into question. All too often in our culture it is assumed that biology doesn't matter and gender (identity as a man or a woman) is not tied to our biological make up or how God created us. This is to separate who we are physically from our identity. In response to wanting people to have equality, our culture strives to eliminate differences. It has also devalued the role of positive masculinity. Challenges to fatherhood do not diminish our need for fathers. Thankfully God teaches us. We

come to know true fatherhood through the teaching of Jesus – who reveals to us the perfect father – God the Father.

We know God as our Father primarily through the teaching of Jesus. In a radical way and intimate way, Jesus preached about God as His Father and invited his disciples (that's us) to know the Father through His Son. "If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him." (John 14:7). There is a lot to consider about Jesus' teaching about His Father – forgiveness, love, strength, humility, courage, faithfulness, etc. We can again and again return to Christ to learn how God is a father to us, how we can accept a father's love, and for men, how to be a father to others – biological, adoptive, relational, or spiritual.

As a priest I am called to be a spiritual father. All the fatherly roles of providing, protecting, educating, loving and sacrificing are part of priesthood, but with a spiritual content and focus. I do this when I celebrate Mass, hear confessions, offer counsel, teach, pray for and serve all those to whom God has appointed me father. It is a humbling and awesome task. I often need help and advice from the men in my life who offer fatherly care and counsel. For them I am grateful.

There are many good Catholic, Christian resources to help men grow as fathers. One I would like to highlight is provided by the Knights of Columbus. It is a website and includes expert advice, ways to strengthen a marriage, discipline of children, spiritual fatherhood, identity of fathers, examples of courageous dads, prayers, etc. The site is: Fathersforgood.org and I encourage you to take a look.

Today let us pray for fathers. Pray for your father, living or deceased. Men, pray to be a good father or father figure. Pray for God to bless all men who show a father's love. Pray for our Church that we can be both a support to fathers and a witness to fatherhood as God the Father calls. Pray for priests, especially me, that we can be holy and effective spiritual fathers. May God bless all our fathers!

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION AND PRECAUTIONS AT MASS

A reminder that with the reinstatement of the joyful obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of obligation most people are now expected to attend Mass in-person. The exceptions are:

- Those who are seriously ill, exhibit flu-like symptoms and/or may have a contagious disease (including quarantine due to exposure).
- Those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own (e.g. transportation issue).
- Those who are homebound and/or incapacitated due to age, infirmity and/or medical restrictions.
- Those who have compromised health conditions and/or at high risk of contracting the virus.

- Those who are caretakers of persons who are sick or of persons at high-risk of serious illness if they contract Covid-19.

Our 8am Sunday Mass will have a section on the north side of the church (Mary statue side) that will retain social distancing. We have adjusted the spacing between those pews to create the distancing. Wearing of masks is required in that section during the 8am Mass. The rest of the church will have seating available in every pew and masks will be optional. Please continue to pray for an end to the pandemic and for all those whose lives continue to be impacted by it. Thank you.

UNITING IN HEART

Last month the first wave of Pastorate Leadership Teams completed their six team building workshops with Our Sunday Visitor (OSV). Here you can read a little about the six topics covered. To hear more about their experience, read the article in the June 6 edition of *The Catholic Moment*.

Managing Change

Change Style for Leadership: A workshop reviewing the 3 types of profiles of how one may experience change. Understanding the differences of how change is embraced leads to implementing change well. The **Change Style Indicator Assessment** is a key part of this course.

Navigating Change: A workshop designed to assist with the implementation of change when a change is occurring. This training assists leaders and individuals in understanding what stage of change they are in and how to move forward towards acceptance.

Conversational Intelligence

The Neuroscience of Conversations: This workshop provides an in-depth view of how words and conversations have power and meaning that can trigger trust or distrust. It also covers the neurochemicals that are stimulated by our words and what part of our brains are activated.

Elevating Team Trust: Using a

T.R.U.S.T model, this workshop guides teams with building positive relationships using truth with grace.

III Levels of Conversations: This workshop reviews 3 different types of conversations, which all have healthy aspects to them, but also unhealthy components. Insight into what may occur when we communicate within those blind spots are key takeaways. Participants also learn to co-create and tap into a part of their brain that sparks creativity, great thinking, and trust.

Listening Intelligence:

This workshop delves into the cognitive behavioral functions of listening and how we all listen to and for different things. When we understand how others listen differently, communication is improved. The assessment provides an individual profile of a person's listening preferences.

Managing Conflict

Reducing Workplace Conflict: A workshop designed to review constructive behaviors, destructive behaviors, and hot buttons (values near and dear to our heart) during times of conflict. The workshop provides essential leadership strategies to manage conflict in an effective manner. The Conflict Dynamic Profile provides an

individualized assessment of how one experiences and reacts to conflict.

Proactive Conflict Resolution for

Teams: This workshop provides Leaders and teams essential skills in proactively addressing Conflict. It reviews techniques for effective communication skills during these challenging times.

Emotional Intelligence and the EQ-I 2.0 Assessment:

This workshop along with the assessment evaluates both emotional and social intelligence, as well as the emotional competencies of an individual. The session along with the assessment provides understanding within 5 composites, with 3 elements within each composite. The 5 composites are Self-Perception, Self-Expression, Interpersonal, Decision Making, and Stress Management.

Working Styles and Personality Preferences Using Myers Briggs:

This workshop provides a self-assessment for attendees to determine how they are energized, how they taken in and perceive information, how they make decisions, and how they approach the outside world. Several activities allow the team to better understand one another's working styles, how they communicate best, and how they approach their work.
