A Note From Fr. Dale

Sharing in the mission of caring for the elderly poor.

St. Jeanne Jugan founded the Little Sisters of the Poor in 1839 to care for the elderly who were poor. Even before she began her community of sisters, she began her ministry by taking an elderly, blind, homeless woman into her own home. Today, the Little Sisters of the Poor welcome their elderly into their homes in over 30 countries around the world. They articulate their mission as:

Continuing the work of Saint Jeanne Jugan, our MISSION is to offer the neediest elderly of every race and religion a home where they will be welcomed as Christ, cared for as family and accompanied with dignity until God calls them to himself.

My family has experienced this mission first-hand. The Little Sisters welcomed my mother in their home in St. Paul, Minnesota a numbers of years ago. She needed assisted living and could not have afforded a quality care facility. As I took her to different places to visit, it was clear that the home of the Little Sisters was by far the best option.

Besides providing a place to live and necessary health care, the Little Sisters share their life and prayer with the residents. They have daily Mass and frequent confessions. If someone isn't able to attend Mass in the chapel, they bring Holy Communion to them in their room. Back during the early days of the pandemic, when churches were closed, I reminded my mother how blessed she was to receive Holy Communion every day – something few Catholics were able to experience. The Little Sisters make spiritual life a priority and tend to the spiritual needs of their residents. Their mission is more than health care. They truly welcome residents as Christ, tend to their needs, and help them prepare for their eternal home.

Typically, the Little Sisters from the St. Augustine Home in Indianapolis would be making an appeal at both St. John Vianney and Holy Spirit at Geist this fall. Due to ongoing pandemic protocols, they have postponed their appeal. We do not yet know when their appeal might happen, but they are still providing care and need our assistance. I ask that you prayerfully consider making a contribution to their life and ministry. Trust me when I say, the Little Sisters make every dollar count and your donation will make a difference in the lives of the elderly poor.




