

A Note From Fr. Dale



Do you see your cup as being half empty or half full? The idiom "cup half empty or full" communicates one's perspective – either optimistic or pessimistic – on life. Gratitude, or being thankful, also greatly depends on our perspective, and view of life. When we recognize our

blessings, we tend to be grateful. When we acknowledge what we have, rather than what we do not have, we can be grateful. How we view "our cup" effects our gratitude.

This week we pause as a nation to celebrate Thanksgiving. It is a time to be grateful and to foster an attitude of thanksgiving. Having an optimistic attitude and seeing our cup as half full is one way to cultivate gratitude. I suggest there is another perspective -a faith vision — that also helps us to be grateful.

From the vision of faith, Thanksgiving begins and ends with God. It begins by acknowledging God's many gifts to us. God created us and loves us. A faith point of view continues with the recognition that God is always loving, taking care of, and blessing us. As Jesus said,

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life and what you will eat, or about your body and what you will wear. For life is more than food and the body more than clothing. Notice the ravens: they do not sow or reap; they have neither storehouse nor barn, yet God feeds them. How much more important are you than birds. (Luke 12:22-24)

With a vision of faith, we can come to the realization that God loves and blesses us, even in and through our difficulties. We not only accept difficulties but can find God in them as well as other blessings. This fosters gratitude. As St. Paul writes in his first letter to the Thessalonians, "In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus." (1 Thess. 5:18) This doesn't mean we like everything or feel good about difficulty or suffering. It means we trust that God can and will use it for our ultimate good – eternal life with Him. Thanksgiving from a faith perspective has God as the focus.

Another way that faith encourages gratitude is by directing us to avoid two of the main obstacles to gratitude – greed and envy. Greed is the passion or desire for possessions, money or power beyond what is appropriate or necessary for our situation in life. It is hard to be grateful if we are seeking and desiring more stuff. Our faith reminds us to focus on what we have rather than the desire for more.

Envy is the desire for what someone else has – money, popularity, health, possessions, etc. Whenever we compare ourselves to others we can be tempted by envy. We might simply start asking ourselves, "Why don't I have that?" Comparing destroys gratitude because again our focus is on what we don't have, rather than the blessings God has given us. We can fix our attention and expectations on what is unrealistic or unnecessary. If we simply focus on how God has blessed us we can't be envious because it is between us and God and not anyone else.

Faith assists us in recognizing that it is God who fills our cup. We can be grateful for whatever he has poured into the cup of our lives. So, this week, take a quiet, prayerful moment to realize the many blessings God has given you. Take time to thank Him for whatever is in your cup. Actually, when we stop and see the abundance of what He has given us we don't see our cup half-empty or half-full, we see it as overflowing. (Psalm 23:5)
