

A Note From Fr. Dale



But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." \sim Acts 1:8

In October of 2003, I was released from my religious community, the Crosiers, and left Minnesota to serve in the Diocese of Lafayette-in-Indiana. My first assignment was to help establish and serve at Guerin Catholic High School, officially known at that time as Blessed Theodore Guerin High School. Since I knew nothing of the new school's namesake, I looked

to research Mother Theodore Guerin. Thankfully, she left a comprehensive journal and many letters. In short order, I was able to learn a lot about this saint who made Indiana her home.

Born Anne-Thérèse Guérin, Sr. Theodore (her religious name) traveled in 1840 with five other sisters from France to Indiana. None spoke English. None had ever been outside of their local region of France. Their perilous journey led them to a small village called St. Mary of the Woods, just across the Wabash River northwest of Terre Haute. Relying on God and the generosity of local people, she soon established a school and home for her community of sisters. Twice she returned to France seeking funding to support her little mission in the Indiana wilderness. Faced with many challenges, Mother Theodore always persevered and trusted in God. Her writings share her experience as a pioneer, with little resources amidst anti-Catholicism. It illustrates her faith which motivated and sustained her and her sisters. She was truly a missionary and responded to Jesus' call to be His witness "to the ends of the earth."

In many ways, our faith springs from a long tradition of missionaries, women, and men who left their homeland to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in a far-off land. Like St. Mother Theodore Guerin, missionaries from Europe, especially France and Ireland, came to bring faith to Indiana. Thank God they were willing to answer the call and accept the sacrifices God placed before them.

Next Sunday the Catholic Church around the world celebrates World Mission Sunday. Since 1926, this Sunday in October has been designated as a time to thank God for the mission of Christ to the ends of the earth and to seek support to further that mission. This year's theme is, "You will be my witnesses... to the ends of the earth." In Pope Francis' message for this year he writes,

"Christ's Church will continue to "go forth" towards new geographical, social and existential horizons, towards "borderline" places and human situations, in order to bear witness to Christ and His love to men and women of every people, culture and social status."

We can all share in the mission work of the Catholic Church. First, we pray that Christ might be known or re-discovered among all people across the globe. We pray for those who commit their lives to serve far from family and native culture. We have many such men and women serving in our country today. We thank God for their sacrifice and their ministry among us.

Another important way we share in the overall mission of the Church across the world is through financial contributions. Your donation to the World Mission Sunday collection goes to the Society of the Propagation of the Faith in Rome. It serves as a clearinghouse and distributes funds to various Pontifical Mission Societies and dioceses around the world that are not self-supporting. Please consider making a gift next weekend on World Mission Sunday. In most of these situations, a few U.S. dollars has an incredible impact.

Everything we have is a gift from God. Our faith and our faith communities are built upon the generosity of missionary men and women who have continually come to our nation. We also have sent women and men to far-off lands to spread the Gospel. That is the mission of the Church. We share in that mission and, like St. Mother Theodore Guerin, trust that whatever we give to God He can use it to build up the Church "to the ends of the earth."
